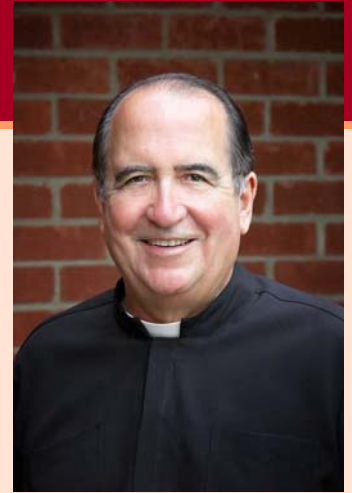

2 Summary of our new plan



It's all about fulfilling the mission of Jesus and the ministry of the Catholic Church in this place we call our spiritual home. Together we are building a legacy of faith and service at OLA under the patronage of Our Lady of the Assumption.

Two years ago, when we began our Capital Campaign and engaged our parishioners to pledge \$5.1 million for renovating our campus, we said: “It’s been over 50 years since we last renovated our church and auditorium... they both need a new roof.” Today, in a season of heavy rains, we can relate to that!

Our present plan really sticks to the basics – undeniable needs that must be met if we are to be responsible stewards of Christ’s mission and ministry at OLA. We have set aside our initial “wish list” of features and focused on practical solutions to our most pressing needs in the church with the help of a new architect. The savings will enable us to do more in other places around our campus for the benefit of all.

- So we begin with a **new roof** which will be attached more securely to the existing steel frame of the church for improved safety. **Required accessibility for the handicapped** will be met with a ramp to the front door, enlarged confessional room, and larger bathrooms for men and women built at the rear (east side) of the auditorium building. A new, **500-square-foot vestibule** facing Berkeley Avenue will make the church entrance more welcoming while preserving the iconic arch that is a beloved feature of our church.
- Inside the church we will have a **place for our musicians** on one side and a place for an **immersion baptismal font** on the other. The **altar will be moved forward** closer to the people to allow the placement of an **adoration chapel** behind it. Systems for sound, video projection, heating and air conditioning will be modernized. **Lighting** will be enhanced with new chandeliers and natural light from side windows and openings in the roof. **New pews and new flooring** will give our worship space a fresh look.
- **Preservation of existing artwork**, such as the stained glass windows of Our Lady, mosaic Stations of the Cross and candle room will be balanced with **new art** – additional stained glass windows, a suspended crucifix, the altar, ambo and presider’s chair, etc. **Outdoor spaces** and walkways around the church will be beautified and made safer.

All in all, we have achieved savings of about \$1 million over the original plan while meeting our goals for a safer, more serviceable and inspiring worship space. Our talented and capable parish committees have provided countless hours of valuable recommendations and advice which has added to our savings. Work will begin this summer.

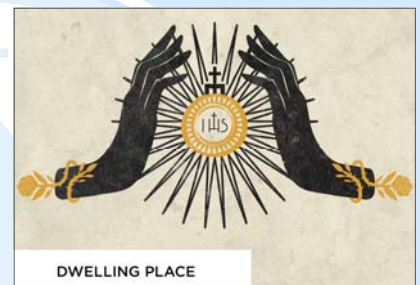

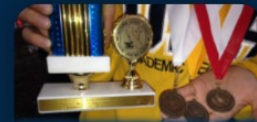

Fair Trade chocolate

Consumers who know the story of chocolate will make their selection with care and choose Fair Trade. Convenient sales of Fair Trade products will be offered Sundays, Jan. 29 and Feb. 12, on the OLA patio after morning Masses.

Most chocolate consumed in the U.S. is sourced from plantations in West Africa which use children who have been kidnapped, sold and often beaten if unproductive. This is one form of human slavery or human trafficking that is not widely known.

By contrast, chocolate that is certified Fair Trade is manufactured through cooperation with plantations that are free of slave labor. Farmers are organized into cooperative that negotiate fair compensation and safe working conditions for laborers. Cooperatives may also provide educational opportunities, medical care for communities, and an equal voice for women. Care is also required for farming practices that protect the environment.

This Valentine's Day, honor your loved one by making the choice with loving values – Fair Trade – and ask local merchants to sell Fair Trade products. Pope Francis says, "It is good for people to realize that purchasing is always a moral act."

You can donate your old or unused prescription glasses to the medical mission to Haiti through Deacon Joe Domond. Bring them to the parish office.

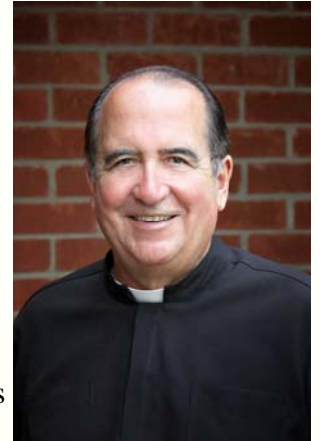
A mission team of doctors, dentists, nurses, ophthalmologists, physical therapists and others will be led by Deacon Joe March 15-26.

Resumen de nuestro plan nuevo



Hace dos años, cuando comenzamos nuestra Campaña Capital y pedimos el apoyo a nuestros feligreses en la recaudación de \$ 5.1 millones para renovar nuestras instalaciones, y se dijo que: "Han pasado más de 50 años desde que renovamos nuestra iglesia y auditorio ... ambos necesitan un techo nuevo". Hoy en una temporada de fuertes lluvias, podemos relacionarnos con eso!

Nuestros planes actuales realmente se adhieren a lo básico - necesidades innegables que deben ser cumplidas si queremos ser corresponsales responsables de la misión y ministerio de Cristo en Nuestra Señora de la Asunción. Hemos apartado nuestra "lista de deseos" iniciales de características y nos hemos enfocados en soluciones prácticas a nuestras necesidades más urgentes en la iglesia con la ayuda de un nuevo arquitecto. Los ahorros nos permitirán hacer más en otros lugares alrededor de nuestras instalaciones para el beneficio de todos.

- Así que comenzamos con un nuevo techo que se unirá con más firmeza a la estructura de acero existente de la iglesia para una mayor seguridad. La accesibilidad requerida para los minusválidos se tendrá con una rampa a la puerta delantera, un confesionario ampliado, y baño más grandes para los hombres y las mujeres construidos en la parte posterior (lado del este) del edificio del auditorio. Un nuevo vestíbulo de 500 pies cuadrados frente a la avenida Berkeley, hará que la entrada de la iglesia sea más acogedora mientras se conserva el icónico arco que es una característica querida de nuestra iglesia.

- Dentro de la iglesia tendremos un lugar para nuestros músicos en un lado y un lugar para una fuente de bautismal de inmersión en el otro. El altar se acercará más a la gente para permitir la colocación de una capilla de adoración detrás de ella. Se modernizarán los sistemas de sonido, proyección de vídeo, calefacción y aire acondicionado. La iluminación se realzará con candelabros nuevos y luz natural de ventanas laterales y aberturas en el techo. Nuevos bancos y pisos nuevos darán a nuestro espacio de adoración un aspecto fresco.

- Preservación de obras de arte existentes, como las ventanas de cristal de color de Nuestra Señora, las estaciones de la Cruz de mosaico y la sala de la velas se equilibrará con arte nuevo - ventanas de cristal de color adicionales, un crucifijo suspendido, el altar, el ambón y la silla del sacerdote, etc. Los espacios al aire libre y los pasillos alrededor de la iglesia serán embellecidos y hechos más seguros.

Con todo, hemos logrado ahorros de alrededor de \$ 1 millón sobre el plan original mientras cumplimos nuestras metas para un espacio de adoración más seguro, más útil e inspirador. Nuestros talentosos y competentes comités parroquiales han proporcionado innumerables horas de valiosas recomendaciones y consejos que han añadido a nuestros ahorros. El trabajo comenzará este verano.
