Judge Jawwaad Rasheed, Oneida County Family Court Justice, spoke with Freshmen and Sophomores as part of our Leadership Speaker Series. A native of Buffalo's east side, Judge Rasheed shared with students his take on what one needs to become successful:



1) Vision; 2) Dedication;

3) Perseverance; 4) Passion and; 5) Faith. Thoroughly engaged by Judge Rasheed's passionate delivery, students were full participants in this Leadership session. The judge challenged students to forge their own paths and never give up on themselves, even in the face of failure. At one point, Judge Rasheed told students that he had "never spoken to any successful person who had not failed... Ask a successful person how many times they failed before they succeeded..." He reminded the students that the important thing about failure is what you do next. "No matter how many times you fall, what's important is that you always get back up."
