Paint

There are a few choices regarding watercolor paint. Watercolor paint comes in squares called pans, half pans and tubes. And in some cases cakes - similar to what you used in school - high quality ones are also OK to use.

Most people prefer the tubes.

Choose a set that is good quality. You'll use less and the colors will be much more intense.

Colors you should have are:

Cadmium Red

Alizarin Crimson

Lemon Yellow

Cadmium Yellow

Yellow Ochre / Raw Sienna Burnt Sienna

Burnt Umber

Hooker's Green / Dark Viridian Sap Green

Ultramarine Blue

Cobalt Blue

Cerulean Blue

Payne's Grey

Black and a tube of Chinese White

If some of these colors are not in your palette, don't worry. We can use alternatives.

Brushes

Regarding brushes, you will need some sable (or synthetic sable)brushes:

1/2 inch or larger Flat - to do washes A No.12 round (optional)

A No.7 pointed round

A No.4 pointed round

A No. 2 Rigger - for fine lines. ...and any othe brush you like.

Other items you'll need

You will need a mixing palette, with multiple wells to mix your colors. A roll of paper towels, a pencil, a kneaded eraser, a roll of 1 inch masking tape, a board to adhere your watercolor paper (we'll talk about this) and watercolor paper. We'll talk about this on the first day of class also.
