Planning for Our Future Phase II Projects Approved by School Board

At Monday night's school board meeting, the board approved the 3-Year Phase II Project plans and a preliminary budget. The Phase II projects will support current and future students and programs in our district. In 2014, the school board developed a Facilities Master Plan in response to our district growth and student program needs. The district has increased in PK-12 enrollment by over 500 students since 2006. The priority of the Facilities Master Plan is to create an exceptional environment for students. Moreover, the plan addresses existing and long-term capacity, safety, security, and efficiency issues at all grade levels in our growing district. Since 2014 the district has completed over 50% of the facility master plan projects.

Our upcoming project will require the pursuit of a bond referendum for up to \$17 million dollars. The district will be working with patrons to form a bond committee to start collecting signatures on a petition starting in January. The committee will present the petition to the school board to bring forward a bond referendum in April for the funding of the Phase II Projects.

Phase II funding sources will be a combination of State Sales Tax Funds and General Obligation Bonds. These funds are designated by Iowa code for infrastructure upgrades, new construction, remodeling of schoolhouses, equipment, and purchasing of property. Phase II Projects would begin the summer of 2018 with substantial completion by the spring of 2021. Phase II Project Plans Include the following:

One of our promises to our community is to be good stewards of taxpayer dollars. The Carlisle School Board has reduced taxes eight years in a row by a total of \$3.11, keeping the promise to lower taxes. This bond proposal would be tax neutral, meaning there would be no increase on the debt service portion of the overall property tax rate. The district currently has the \$4.05 debt service levy in our current tax levy. The district will be asking our community for the authority to use the debt service levy for the new \$17 million of bonds for the Phase II projects.

The district will be holding public information meetings and communicating to patrons about the Phase II projects and bond referendum prior to the April election. Iowa School Report Card

Knowing where you are and where you want to go is a key part of growth and improvement. Our schools regularly use academic performance data to tell us how our students are progressing and to adjust instruction for better results. While the report only tell part of the story through data, they support what we know about our district: our schools are doing very well. All Carlisle schools ranked in the upper 46% of all schools in the state, with two of our schools being the top performers in Warren County. Carlisle Elementary ranked in the upper 2% in state receiving a ranking of Exceptional and Carlisle High School ranked in the upper 8% in the state with a "High-Performing" ranking. Both Carlisle Middle School and Hartford Upper Elementary ranked in the upper 46% with a ranking of "Acceptable".

The Iowa School Report Card shows a snapshot of how Iowa schools are performing based on eight measures: student proficiency rates, student growth toward college and career readiness, annual expected growth, closing the achievement gap, college and career readiness, graduation rate, attendance, and staff retention. 

CHS Winter Walking







Each grade level will be responsible for a general category of personal care items; however, all donations will gladly be accepted! Students can bring items to their classroom teachers. The class in each grade level that brings in the most items will receive a class reward after winter break!

<u>Pre-School and Kindergarten</u>: Paper Products - paper plates, napkins, paper towels, facial tissues, toilet paper, cotton balls, band aids, and other related items

1st Grade: Soaps/Shampoos - shampoo, conditioner, body wash, dish soap, laundry detergent, dryer sheets, and other related items



Just a reminder the Carlisle Schools Food Pantry is open to the public on the 1st and 3rd Thursdays of the month from 4:00 p.m.—6:00 p.m. at the West entrance of the High School building in Room 106. (The doors between the Elementary and High School). Please do not arrive before 3:40 p.m. to allow our students and buses to safely exit the facility.

This new location allows us to have more food on hand during our open times to serve more families. Students who attend Carlisle Schools have access to the food pantry every day that school is in session. If a student or family is in need they should see their school counselor in the building for assistance. Hartford Upper Elementary and Carlisle Middle School also have a mini pantry to help students and families at any time.
