Intellectual and Developmental Disability Services (IDD)

A healthy community creates opportunities for everyone to share their gifts and talents and make meaningful contributions. Integral Care works with children and adults living with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities to make sure they have the tools they need to thrive.



Eligibility Criteria

Intellectual Disability (IDD)

- ID=Intellectual Disability
- Intellectual disability is a disability characterized by significant limitations in both **intellectual functioning** and in **adaptive behavior**, which covers many everyday social and practical skills. This disability originates **before the age of 18**.
- Intellectual Functioning is IQ
- Adaptive Behavior includes
 - Conceptual skills
 - Social skills
 - Practical skills

Eligibility Criteria

Development Disability (DD)

- Developmental Disability means a disability that is manifested before the person reaches twenty-two (22) years of age, which constitutes a substantial disability to the affected individual, and is attributable to intellectual disability or related conditions which include cerebral palsy, epilepsy, autism or other neurological conditions when such conditions result in impairment of general intellectual functioning or adaptive behavior similar to that of a person with an intellectual disability.

Examples of DD

- Autism Spectrum Disorders
- Cerebral Palsy
- Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder
- Fragile X Syndrome
- Hearing Loss
- Muscular Dystrophy
- Tourette Syndrome
- Vision Impairment

- ICF group homes

Overview of Integral Care Services

- Provider Services:
 - Texas Home Living (TxHmL)
 - Employment Services
 - General Revenue
 - DARS
 - Community Based Support (CBS) Team
 - Crisis Intervention Specialist (CIS)
 - Positive Assistive Community Engagement (PACE)

Intake and Eligibility

- Includes participating in an appointment with an intake specialist and psychologist. Assessments are completed to determine if the individual qualifies as a person with an intellectual or developmental disability (IDD).
- All possible services are explained and offered at point of intake
 - ICF, Waiver Interest lists, GR, Diversion, CFC, etc.

General Revenue Services

- GR provides both service coordination and direct services to individuals with IDD.
- GR service coordinators explain various community services and develop an annual Person Centered Plan with the Individual.
- GR direct services include:
 - Respite
 - Service Coordination

Community Living Options Information Process (CLOIP)

- CLOIP services residents of the State Supported Living Center (SSLC) by providing community living options information and tours of community programs.
 - CLOIP attends the annual Person Centered Planning meeting to discuss community living options along with ensuring proper support is provided when transferring to the community.

Enhanced Community Coordination (ECC)

- ECC assists residents of State Supported Living Centers and Nursing Facilities who are moving into the community.
 - Services include being actively involved in transition planning meetings for the individuals and providing continuity of care from the institution to the community.
 - The program also provides enhanced monitoring for individuals once they move to the community to ensure a successful transition.

Preadmission Screening and Resident Review (PASRR)

- PASRR serves residents of nursing facilities who have IDD.
- Services include:
 - meeting with the individual on a quarterly basis to discuss community options and develop a Person Directed Plan
 - PASRR also ensures that the individual receives appropriate specialized services and opportunities for supports to be put into place for transition into the community.
 - Specialized services include behavioral support, independent living skills, day habilitation, and employment services



Service Coordination (SC)

- Service Coordination involves explaining HCS and TxHmL services to the individual and LAR along with developing a Person Directed Plan. Service coordinators meet with individuals on a monthly basis to ensure services are provided consistent with the agreed upon plan and to the individual's satisfaction.

Community First Choice (CFC)

- Community First Choice (CFC) provides services and supports to individuals living in the community who are enrolled in the Medicaid program and meet CFC eligibility requirements. Services and supports may include:
 - personal assistance services;
 - Habilitation;
 - emergency response services; and
 - support management.

Texas Home Living (TxHmL)

- TxHmL is a 1915(c) Medicaid waiver program that provides services and supports to people with IDD to help them continue to live with their families or on their own.
- Services include but are not limited to:
 - community support
 - behavioral support
 - employment assistance
 - Nursing
 - day habilitation
 - respite

Employment Services

- Employment services provide ongoing individualized supports needed by an individual to sustain paid work in an integrated work setting. Consumers are pre-screened and trained in various job skillsets required for entry-level jobs and the program ensures they are successful after placed with an employer

Community Intervention Specialist (CIS)

- For individuals ages 3 – 99 with confirmed IDD diagnosis
- Services run for 90 days
- Goal is to support individuals to remain in the community by providing crisis prevention services
- Provide crisis intervention and crisis prevention through coordination and skills training
- Provide referrals to other services and programs within the Travis County area

Community Based Support (CBS) Team

- For individuals ages 3 – 99 with confirmed IDD diagnosis
- Services are long term
- Goal is to support individuals experiencing a crisis to remain in the community or return to the community if in a psychiatric hospital
- Provides crisis prevention supports to individuals and their systems of support
- Assist individual to create a system that reflects their needs

Positive Assistive Community Engagement (PACE)

- Serve individuals diagnosed with IDD who are experiencing a crisis by providing in home respite support
- PACE will provide in home therapeutic supports to help stabilize and support an individual's transition back into their residence following a crisis event, or to help an individual maintain their current housing to prevent the unnecessary use of psychiatric hospitals.
- Individuals in crisis may receive in-home crisis services for a period of 72 (non continuous) hours. It will be provided for a minimum of two (2) hours per day and can be lengthened if deemed necessary.

- HCS and TxHmL Interest Lists for Travis County are maintained by Integral Care

- CLASS, MDCP, and DBMD Interest Lists are maintained by HHSC.
 - Call 1-877-438-5658 to be added or for annual contact
- Funds for new Waiver Slots are authorized by the Legislature when they meet each biennial
- ☹️ 2018 Legislature did not fund any new HCS and TxHmL Slots
- Requirement to contact Integral Care annually to ensure we have your correct contact information.
