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What do you “see” that you don’t “see”?

5th and 6th grade students used the 21st Century skills of collaboration, critical thinking and communication, while also using the science process skills of observation of inferencing as they studied atoms and molecules. Students worked in groups to “see” what they couldn’t see in order to understand that even though they can’t see atoms and molecules, they are there. The students had 30 seconds to observe an art print and list these things. (ex: legs of the man behind the counter, fish under water). Each group then rotated and tried to find other things that weren’t already found in the next art print. This helped them take an abstract concept and make it concrete. They then shared what they found in each print without duplicating another group.
