ROWLAND HIGH SCHOOL COMPLETES FIRST PHASE

The first phase of modernization for Rowland High School broke ground on June 13, 2012 and the community celebrated its completion at the school's 50th anniversary held on September 26, 2014. Two new buildings were completed: Building D was expanded to nine classrooms housing science classes - Physics, Anatomy, Biology, Chemistry and Earth Science. Each room features individual lab stations, interactive whiteboards, chemical resistant cabinets, countertops and flooring, and the chemistry rooms feature fume hoods. Building E houses mainly the Career Technical Education classrooms. Every classroom has new doors, flooring and tackable wall surfaces. Many rooms have interactive whiteboards and voice amplification. It also includes four new computer labs, the modernized Rainbow Preschool facility, and child care and home economics rooms. The culinary arts room was previously modernized, but recently technology upgrades were added.



The expanded new Rainbow Preschool has operated on Rowland High's campus for more than 30 years! The popular ROP child development program for high school students now features larger rooms, new carpeting, walls, windows, lighting, furniture and storage.

NOGALES HIGH SCHOOL REVIVAL



The excitement was high as work began on a new Noble look for Nogales High School! The estimated \$25 million Revival Project (the majority paid by savings from previous projects) includes four new buildings, student drop-off areas and parking lots with improved lighting.



Buildings include: A two-story structure with classrooms and administrative offices, a food services building with covered dining, a staff lounge and a basketball-court sized Multipurpose Room with an indoor/outdoor stage area for student activities. Another

building includes a "Super Room" with four classrooms that can be joined together for a large meeting space.

Progress as of June 2014:

Underground electrical infrastructure installation began. *Building A:* Structural steel erection 50% complete; *Building B:* Structural steel erection 95% complete, installation of metal deck 50% complete and scaffolding to the second floor is complete. *Building C:* Concrete slab poured and structural steel delivery pending. *Building D:* Footings were poured and under slab utilities are in the process of being installed.

HOLLINGWORTH ELEMENTARY
