Integrated Math 1 Recovery Program

The information below pertains to students who do not pass tasks.

What is the Integrated Math 1 Recovery Program?

- This program is designed to help students who have difficulties understanding and mastering concepts taught in Integrated Math 1.
- It offers personalized assistance to students under the guidance of an Integrated Math teacher.
- Students practice concepts by completing individualized worksheets as assessed by the recovery teacher.
- Students work at their own pace until they show mastery of those concepts by taking and passing their tasks.

What are the requirements to pass the Integrated Math 1 course?

- Students must pass all the tasks given every semester to receive credit for this course regardless of their current grade in the class.
- Students must receive at least 60% on each task to satisfy the Integrated Math 1 requirement.
- Tasks are given at the end of each chapter taught.

Who participates in this program?

- Students who do not pass a task with at least 60% are expected to attend the Integrated Math 1 Recovery Program offered before school, during 0 period, or after school, during 7th period.
- Teachers will communicate with each other to discuss and monitor the progress of each student attending recovery.
- Students who show mastery of the objectives missed on a task may stop attending the Recovery Program.

When and where is the Integrated Math 1 Recovery Program taking place?

- It will be available during 0 and 7th period.
 - 0 period: Monday through Friday from 7:15 am to 8:05 am in room 36.
 - 7th period: Tuesday through Friday from 2:40 pm to 3:37 pm in room 37.
- It is recommended for students to attend the Integrated Math 1 Recovery Program for a regular basis to achieve mastery of the objectives missed on the tasks.

How long do students have to recover a task?

- Students may complete recovery in a few days, while others may need much more time to master the objectives they missed on a task.
- Students must complete recovery in a timely manner.

What happens when students complete recovery of a unit?

- Students' respective Integrated Math I teachers are notified by email that a student has passed their task
- Students' grades are changed by their respective Integrated Math 1 teacher.

What happens to students' grades when they fail a task but pass the test for the next chapter?

- Students earn a temporary F until they have recovered every task on which they received less than 60%.

What happens if students do not complete recovery during the school year?

- Students who do not pass all of the tasks and do not complete recovery will have to repeat Integrated Math 1.

How does the grading system work?

- Students must pass each of the tasks with at least 60% to receive credit in Integrated Math 1 regardless of the grades earned in the classroom during the 6-week grading period.
- Students receive an F in the course if they fail to participate in the Integrated Math 1 Recovery Program to show mastery of the objectives they missed on any of the tasks.
- Students class grade will be changed after recovery is completed to reflect their current math grade
