The School and Community:

Enosburg Falls High School (EFHS) is a public high school serving seven rural communities in northern Franklin County. The greater EFHS community has deep roots in agriculture and dairy farming, and sits at the heart of the maple sugar industry in Vermont. The community is supportive of the school and its students, and in turn the school supports a wide array of community-minded groups. EFHS is well known for the caring and supportive relationships we establish with our students. It is through these relationships that we build both flexibility and rigor into the academic program of each student. Nearly half of our current enrollment of 345 students come to our school through school choice. While the overall trend for student enrollment in Vermont is declining, EFHS has consistently increased its numbers over the last five years. Family incomes vary widely in our community, but most students come from households of modest means. Over 60% of Enosburg students come from families where neither parent has graduated from a four-year college, and 46% of students receive free or reduced lunch. Our families choose EFHS for the flexibility, rigor, and support students receive through our programming in becoming college and career ready.

The Academic Program:

Designed to motivate and challenge all students, the academic program at Enosburg Falls High School is driven by equity and the highest possible learning expectations for students. Our proficiency-based learning and graduation policies ensure that all students leave as highly literate and skilled graduates. During their high school career, students have access to a wide range of learning experiences, including Advanced Placement courses and dual-enrollment opportunities at local colleges. All students are required to demonstrate proficiency against consistently applied and assessed learning standards, which are documented using digital portfolios that students maintain as evidence of their learning progress and achievements. All learning experiences are academically rigorous and intended to prepare students for success in college, career, and citizenship.

Flexible Pathways and Highlights of the Academic Program

- Dual Enrollment courses are offered to students beginning in the summer following grade 10 (some in house) and are completed by 30% of graduates. EFHS is offering concurrent courses in applied math-concepts, pre-calculus, pre-calculus 2, calculus for engineering, and advanced physics.
- Early College is available for college-ready students in their senior year. Five students in the class of 2018 are participating in Early College.
- Flexible independent study opportunities called ELO's (Extended Learning Opportunities) allow students to meet proficiencies based on individual interest.
- Cold Hollow Career Center (CHCC) offers 5 programs to an average of 30% of EFHS students.
- Internship opportunities are available to students through CHCC.
- Advanced Placement courses in Statistics, United States Government and Politics, and Chemistry are open to all tenth through twelfth grade students.
- Online high school courses are offered through Vermont Virtual Learning Cooperative (VTVLC) and reflect the same academic rigor as EFHS courses.
- All students complete a community service requirement of 10 hours per year prior to graduating.
- Project-based learning is embedded throughout the curriculum, and most courses engage students in long-term investigative projects, which often address local issues affecting the community.
