

FRENCH I CLASSES for SPRING SEMESTER

WCA is pleased to offer your child the opportunity to learn French beginning January 19, 2018. The ten week French I course will be taught by French instructor Agnes Cappello from 1:30 – 3:30 on Fridays, excluding holidays.

Level 1 French will target the four areas of language development: reading, listening, speaking, and writing. Students will communicate about their immediate world and daily activities, read material on familiar topics, and write short sentences. They will learn to communicate through mini-dialogues to develop fluency, confidence, and articulation skills. Students in French I will understand grammar in certain contexts, develop phonetics and spelling skills, and be prepared to begin Level II in the fall of 2018.

Born in France and earning her degree in 1982 in AIX-Marseille in education, she subsequently attended the University of Aix-En-Provence and earned her BA in French literature. In 1996 she began work at ULL towards certification in French education and earned her Masters Degree in Modern Languages. In 2002 she earned the La. State Department of Education Certification in Elementary and Middle School French Immersion. Fluent in French and English, she also has a working knowledge in Italian. She currently is teaching French at the Alliance Francaise of Lafayette for beginners, intermediates, and advanced levels. In the past she has taught French at local private and public schools.

French I classes will be offered to 3rd grade - 6th grade students. Tuition will be \$250.00 for the ten week course, payable in full at the first lesson or by two predated checks of \$125.00 each, due at the first lesson and dated January 19, 2018 and February 19, 2018. Checks are payable to Mrs. Cappello.

This is an exciting opportunity for WCA to have a native born French speaker with such experience in the classroom. Our desire is that, with continued participation, our students will graduate as seniors with a fluency in French that will allow them to communicate easily in French speaking countries.
