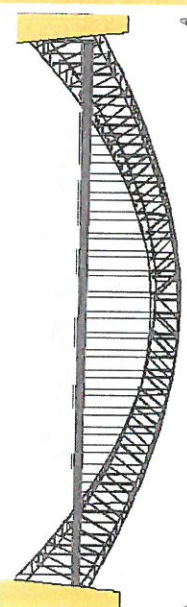

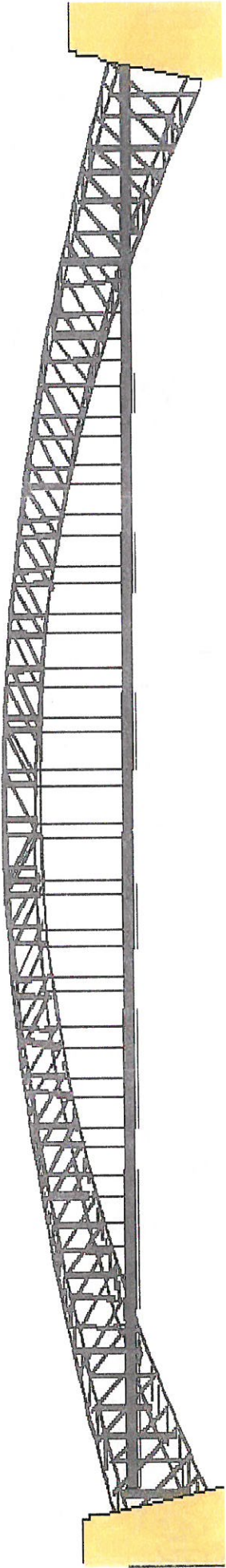

The Bridge Project



What Is It?



What is The Bridge Project?

The Bridge Project is a program that helps “bridge the funding gap” for people with developmental disabilities who need employment services, but do not have a Medicaid waiver to pay for those services.

Bridge can pay for services to help you prepare for and get employment such as:

- ◆ Job preparation
- ◆ Job exploration
- ◆ Job development
- ◆ Job coaching
- ◆ Job retention

Who qualifies for The Bridge Project?

To qualify for Bridge you must be:

- ◆ Over 21 years old
- ◆ Out of high school
- ◆ Enrolled with the Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA)
- ◆ Not on a DDA Medicaid waiver
- ◆ Interested in individual supported employment in a community job (not group supported employment or Prevocational employment)
- ◆ Willing to work with the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR) if eligible for their services. If not eligible, Bridge will provide employment services

What happens in The Bridge Project.

- 1) Complete an application and consent form.
- 2) Get an acceptance letter from Spokane County’s Developmental Disabilities program.
- 3) Go to DVR for services. (If not eligible, Bridge will assist with employment services.)
- 4) Work with DVR (or Bridge) to find a job.
 - a. Develop an employment plan.
 - b. Work with a job developer.
 - c. Find a job.
 - d. Work with a job coach to learn job duties.
