SCHOLARSHIP CATEGORY	AWARD DESCRIPTION
COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD	<p>Getting involved in your local community by volunteering your time, skills, and positive energy helps create vibrant communities. It implies a selfless act of kindness that helps those less fortunate, but can also be interpreted as contributing to the “Higher Good”-that is, the service provided goes beyond the selfish needs, desires or interest of the individual who performs it.</p> <p>Students applying for this scholarship should have a committed history of community service throughout their high school career.</p>
MERIT BASED AWARD	<p>The merit-based award recognizes students who show outstanding academic and leadership abilities. Applicants should have stellar academic records, challenging coursework, and exemplary standardized test scores.</p>
NEED BASED AWARD	<p>Family income is only one of several factors involved in determining the need-based scholarship awardee. Other important factors include the number of household members and the number of other household members attending college.</p>
NON-TRADITIONAL STUDENT	<p>The NAACP will follow the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) definition of a non-traditional student. A non-traditional student includes anyone who satisfies at least one of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Delays enrollment (does not enter postsecondary education in the same calendar year that he or she finished high school) • Attends part-time for at least part of the academic year • Works full-time (35 hours or more per week) while enrolled • Is considered financially independent for purposes of determining eligibility for financial aid • Has dependents other than a spouse (usually children, but may also be caregivers of sick or elderly family members) • Is a single parent (either not married or married but separated and has dependents) • Does not have a high school diploma (completed high school with a GED)
