

Facilities update



In July I begin my ninth year as pastor. My role as pastor is to be the bearer of the community's vision: To help the people see a future full of wonderful possibilities while also helping them recognize their own potential. From the beginning, I have accepted this role, as well as the great responsibilities that come with it. When challenges rise up, as they surely will, through prayer I must call forth the courage that comes from trusting God's plan.

1. The current vision of the OLA community includes an updated church that will radiate a sense of welcome, drawing people closer to God in prayer. I believe a church should also be a place of refuge in difficult times for both young and old. To this end, we have mounted a successful capital campaign that gathered \$5.1 million in commitments from generous parishioners; with \$2.2 million paid to date. The renovation plans are drawn up and are being refined as I write this.
2. We had hoped to begin construction this summer, but we have not received approval of our plans from the Archdiocesan Building and Liturgical Commissions. The final approval from these entities is still pending, and we cannot move on to the next phase without their permission. The next presentation of our revised plans is scheduled for September, with great anticipation of approval. Once we have been approved, we can begin creation of working blueprints, the bidding process, and signing of contracts. Realistically, this will move the start of construction to Spring 2018.
3. Our worship space will be beautified with art, from the design of a new altar and crucifix, to additional stained glass windows and other furnishings. Surrounding the church will be a new landscape design of walkways and planters. The church will be energy efficient, with improved accessibility at church entrances, bathrooms and one confessional. You are invited to view the drawings on the parish website at www.olaclaremont.org.

Thank you for your continued prayers for the success of our church renovation project. Even though we had hoped to start the construction sooner, we trust that the Lord's timing is perfect. In the midst of the unexpected, let us give thanks that some things have *not* changed: Our councils, committees and staff continue to exercise good stewardship of the parish's financial assets, *your* contributions. Our parishioners continue to be engaged in faithfully supporting our mission and ministries. God is present among us at OLA! We continue this wonderful journey of stepping out together in faith and trusting that all good things will come to those who wait on the Lord.

This survey will give us a collective view of the spiritual health of our parish. The data will show us where we are doing well and help us see the areas that need our attention to make us a stronger parish.

The surveys will be tabulated by the renowned Gallup organization in strict confidentiality. Results will be communicated to the parish-at-large as soon as they are available.

Results of the survey will also form the foundation for the strategic planning process which has just begun. The OLA Pastoral Council will be joined by a core group of parish leaders at several key planning meetings during the summer. In the fall, the parish coordinating councils will continue writing a new mission statement, new strategic goals and action plans for the next three years. **See the council reports on Page 8.**

Ordinary Time: Summer

What do the words Ordinary Time mean? Dorothy Day said, “The words ‘Ordinary Time’ in our prayer books put me in a state of confusion and irritation. To me, no time is ordinary.” She was right. The Ordinary in “Ordinary Time” refers to ordinal – counted – time, not to a lack of something to celebrate. The Roman document, *General Norms for the Liturgical Year and Calendar*, says: “Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character [Advent, Christmastime, Lent, Triduum and Eastertime], 33 or 34 weeks remain in the yearly cycle that do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on the Sundays, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects.”

How do we celebrate “the mystery of Christ in all its aspects”? We gather every Sunday. Sunday is our original feast day. Christians have gathered every Sunday – the day of Christ’s resurrection, the first day of the week – ever since there were Christians.

When we gather on Sundays in Ordinary Time, as always, we hear the Scriptures proclaimed. The Church reads straight through “the Gospel of the year,” either Matthew, Mark or Luke, each week often picking up where we left off last week. (We read John during Lent and Easter, and on feasts.) The first readings, from the first testament of the Bible, have been chosen for their relationship to the Gospel passages. Many voices are heard throughout summer Ordinary Time. We also read through some of the letters of the second testament of the Bible. The mystery of Christ “in all its aspects” unfolds.

What is the heart of our Sunday celebration? We do our Eucharist; that is, we do our thanksgiving. We praise and thank God for all creation; we pray for the whole world, as we remember Christ’s life, death and resurrection. We share the bread and wine, the body and blood. We are sent forth to be the body and blood of Christ in our homes, our workplaces, our neighborhoods, our towns, our cities, our country, our world.

This study module from JustFaith explores the realities of food insecurity in the United States and around the world. It was created in partnership with Bread for the World to inspire faith-filled action.

Desde el principio, he aceptado este papel como también las grandes responsabilidades que le acompañan. Cuando surgen desafíos como seguramente lo harán, a través de la oración, debo invocar el valor que viene de confiar en el plan de Dios.


La visión actual de la comunidad incluye una iglesia actualizada que dará un sentido de bienvenida, acercando a las personas a Dios en la oración. Creo que una iglesia también debe ser un lugar de refugio en tiempos difíciles para todas las edades. Con este fin, hemos montado una exitosa campaña capital que recaudó \$5.1 millones en compromisos de generosos feligreses; con 2.2 millones de dólares pagados hasta la fecha. Los planes de renovación se elaboran y se están perfeccionando a medida que escribo esto.

Habíamos esperado comenzar la construcción este verano, pero no hemos recibido la aprobación de nuestros planes del Comité de Construcción y Liturgia de la Archidiócesis. La aprobación final de estas entidades aún está pendiente, y no podemos pasar a la siguiente fase sin su permiso. La próxima presentación de nuestros planes actualizados está programada para septiembre, con gran anticipación de aprobación. Una vez que seamos aprobados, podemos comenzar la creación de planos de trabajo, el proceso de oferta, y la firma de contratos. Realísticamente, esto moverá el comienzo de la construcción a la primavera del 2018.

Nuestro espacio de adoración será embellecido con el arte, desde el diseño de un nuevo altar y crucifijo, hasta otros vitrales y otros muebles. Alrededor de la iglesia será un nuevo diseño de pasarelas y maseteros. La iglesia será eficiente energéticamente, con accesibilidad mejorada en las entradas de la iglesia, baños y confesionarios. Gracias por sus continuas oraciones por el éxito de este proyecto de renovación de la iglesia. Aunque esperaríamos comenzar la construcción antes, confiamos en que el tiempo del Señor es perfecto. En medio de lo inesperado, agradezcamos que algunas cosas no hayan cambiado: nuestros consejos, comités y personal siguen ejerciendo una buena administración de los bienes de la parroquia, sus contribuciones. Nuestros feligreses continúan comprometidos en apoyar fielmente nuestra misión y ministerios. Dios está presente entre nosotros. Continuamos este maravilloso viaje de salir juntos en la fe y confiando en que todas las cosas buenas vendrán a los que esperan en el Señor.

End of year report from our councils

The Pastoral Council is laying the groundwork for a new strategic plan for OLA covering the next three years. Last month on Leadership Night, parish leaders celebrated achievements under our current goals and learned about the process for a new strategic plan. The timeline begins with the parish survey now underway. Last week, parish leaders were invited to become part of the planning process at orientation sessions. In July, the task force will analyze parish Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats (SWOT). In August, the task force will review survey results and identify values that define the OLA community.

In September and October, the task force will work on Mission/Vision/Goals, assisted by our coordinating councils (see below). A new Parish Mission Statement and Parish Strategic Plan with action steps should be ready by year's end.



What we want the parish to know this month...

Administration...

This council reported that our Fiesta was very successful this year, earning over \$100,000 in profit for parish operations. The school has been awarded a full six-year accreditation from WCEA.

Community Life...

This council is coordinating the Parish Picnic and Ministry Expo on Saturday, Aug. 26. OLA Summer School and Summer Camp are available to help families keep kids occupied through July. Several OLA groups will be at Memorial Park/Claremont on July 4.

Formation...

This year, OLA will sponsor both a high school/young adult summer mission trip and a mission trip for junior high students – a first! The parish send-off for Elena Cardena, outgoing Director of Faith Formation, will be Sunday, July 9, after morning Masses.

Outreach...

This council had impressive stats for the recent *Laudato Si* Outreach Expo: Over 20 groups staffed information tables; 500 adults attended the expo; and 50-75 children enjoyed free face-painting.

A young adult ministry has been launched. A couple from OLA has been chosen to head the regional *Encuentro Matrimonial* (Marriage Encounter).
