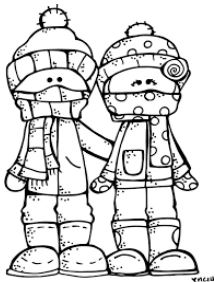

Dear Parents/Guardians,

With the new year upon us, I want to reinforce some of our safety procedures for all our students and staff:

- Arrive to school on time. Our doors open at 8:45 a.m. We have many students coming much earlier and are unsupervised!
- Sign in and out of our building at the Main Office and obtain a visitor's pass.
- Do not use our designated bus parking for pick up/drop off or parking . Please use the parking lot off of Stanley Place.
- Drive slowly on/around our campus during arrival and dismissal times.
- If your child is going to miss school, please call us and leave a message with our nurses.
- Upon returning to school, please provide the school with a note.
- Please send in a note for any changes to your child's transportation for the day. Calling our office for these changes during the day should be reserved for emergencies only. Calling during the day creates a potential safety issue.



At this time of year, it is a good idea to talk with/to children about **cold weather safety**. Extra care is needed to be sure that frostbite does not occur.

- It is important to **check** your children's **outerwear** everyday during extreme weather conditions. Warm jackets, hats, scarves, boots, and an extra pair of dry gloves in their pockets will protect them during extremely cold temperatures.
- If your child is going to participate in outside recess during lunch, they must bring their jacket, boots, hats and gloves.
- Students will not be going outside for recess below a "real feel" temperature of 15 degrees!

As in the past, the Le Roy Police Department continues to be visible both inside and outside our buildings. Our resource officer, Officer Miller, also continues to be active in and around our school. We will continue to conduct emergency drills throughout the remainder of the year. We now have a PA system to communicate with everyone outside our building. Again, with the temperatures, it is most important for our students to be properly dressed. You never know when we have to be outside for ANY reason.

On the academic front, I can not stress enough, the importance of having your child read every night. This is a very important part of your child's learning. As for math, please continue to reinforce addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division facts for fluency depending on your child's grade level. These are the building blocks for your child's entire math experience.
