University of Redlands: Medium-size private university offering liberal arts, pre-professional programs, business, school of music, DIII athletics, scholarships and financial aid accepting around 65-70% of applicants <http://www.redlands.edu/>

Claremont Colleges: Small, selective. Consortium of five undergraduate liberal arts colleges, rigorous curriculum, small classes, distinguished professors, and personalized instruction in a vibrant residential college community that provides intensive interaction between students and faculty. <http://www.claremont.edu/>

California State Polytechnic University, Pomona: Medium-larger sized university. Polytechnic campus emphasizing experiential learning, instruction of technical arts and applied sciences. Over 90 majors, DIII athletics, clubs and organizations. <http://www.cpp.edu/>
