You may have noticed lately as you visit our schools or travel around town that Northville Public Schools is *under construction*. All thanks to the incredible support of our community in passing a \$104.85 million bond proposal in November 2017. The bond funds are allowing the district to update aging facilities, enhance security, and provide modern learning facilities across the district. Thoughtful planning is taking place and construction has begun in earnest on this comprehensive, multi-year facilities upgrade and construction program that will touch every classroom and every school.

Please note that all Northville Public Schools' buildings are closed for Spring Break beginning **Friday, March 30, 2018, through Friday, April 6, 2018**, other than for specific Spring Break programs. **Classes will resume on Monday, April 9, 2018.**

Our Board of Education offices, located at 501 West Main Street in Northville, will be very lightly staffed on Monday, April 2, 2018 through Friday, April 6, 2018 from 8:00 a.m.-

3:30 p.m., and available for phone calls and/or scheduled appointments. Regular business hours and staffing will resume on Monday, April 9, 2018.

Also, for your future planning please note that there will be no school for Northville Public Schools students on **Tuesday, April 10, 2018**, due to a Teacher Professional Development Day and state-mandated testing for Northville High School freshmen, sophomores and juniors.

SAFETY AND SECURITY IN OUR SCHOOLS

School safety and security are a primary concern to each one of us—students, parents, teachers, administrators and staff—and we work hard to ensure that our schools are secure and supportive places to teach and learn.

As a school district, we continue to review and evaluate our security measures on an ongoing basis. We recently strengthened our visitor management protocols to more consistently require individuals to show identification, state their name, and say the purpose of their visit before being let

into a school building. Longer term, the Bond 2017 proposal generously approved by the community in November 2017 includes entry-way redesigns in all of our school buildings to further enhance existing security measures.

In addition, our school staff works together with students, families, police and fire departments, and community leaders to keep our schools as safe as possible. Beginning in August, 2016, we adopted the ALICE protocol, and annually provide training and conduct safety drills with our students and staff. ALICE (Alert, Lockdown,



Inform, Counter, Evacuate) empowers adults and students with strategies to keep themselves and each other safe through access to more information, a greater emphasis on evacuating when possible, enhancing lockdown protocols, and providing age-appropriate lessons and information.

We limit access to our buildings during the school-day by locking doors and monitoring who comes in and out. We also practice different kinds of drills to keep everyone safe, and we ask everyone to be watchful and to report anything that seems out of the ordinary. We have the support of our local police and fire departments, including police liaison officers from the Northville Township Police Department and the Novi Police Department, who work directly with our schools, students and families.

We also encourage our students to be observant and let an adult know if they see or hear something that makes them feel uncomfortable, nervous or frightened. There is a difference between reporting and tattling or gossiping. Our schools make sure students are aware of Michigan's [OK2SAY](#) hotline, and offer the Department of

Attorney General's Michigan Cyber Safety Initiative program, with student safety content tailored specifically for each grade level. There are a number of resources available for students, teachers and parents readily available on the State of Michigan website at these links:



Our **Early Childhood Education and Extended Day Programs** also offer **Kids' Club** at each elementary school. This tuition-based program allows parents the option to have their child participate in a before- and/or after-school childcare program. **Kids' Club** is offered as an option on school days from as early as 7:00 a.m. to the start of school and from school dismissal until 6:00 p.m. Early Childhood also offers **Half-Day, Pre-K PLUS, School-Day and Full-Day** programs for preschool-aged children who are toilet trained. NORTHVILLE ACHIEVES PERFECT MUNETRIX SCORE FOR FIFTH CONSECUTIVE YEAR

Northville Public Schools is one of 36 school districts in Michigan recognized for receiving a perfect Munetrix fiscal indicator score of zero for three consecutive years –indicating strong fiscal stewardship among district leaders. The perfect Munetrix scores are for the 2016-17, 2015-16 and 2014-15 school years and are based on the audited school district data provided by the Michigan Department of Education. *Northville Public Schools achieved the perfect rating of "0" in 2012-13 and has maintained this rating for five consecutive years.* The Munetrix Score range is

zero to 10 with zero being a perfect score. Munetrix's algorithms mash 12 critical data points over three years while looking for chronic or high magnitude problems such as a tenuous fund balance and large enrollment swings. Michigan-based Munetrix is among the nation's largest aggregators of municipal and school district data.

POINTS OF PRIDE FROM ACROSS THE DISTRICT

Every day in our classrooms, through the arts, on our fields of play, and through extracurricular endeavors, our students and teachers from across Northville Public Schools give us much to celebrate. Here are just a few recent highlights.

- Congratulations to Northville High School Mandarin 1 students **Robert Kuphal** and **Charlotte Beaudoin**, both seniors, who recently took first place in the division 1 competition at the **10th annual China Quiz Bowl** at Schoolcraft College. The Michigan China Quiz Bowl, sponsored by the Wayne State University Confucius Institute, is a competition in which teams of middle and high school across Michigan test their knowledge of the Chinese language and geography.



- I am delighted to share that Northville Public Schools has been named a **2018 Academic State Champ** school district by *Bridge Magazine*, placing sixth among other large school districts. Only 30 schools statewide received this honor. Academic State Champ school districts are honored for how much their students' progress from third to eighth grade, using the Stanford University analysis of more than 500 public school districts in Michigan. The research was part of a national study of millions of students that measured academic performance and a host of socioeconomic data. With more than a million readers, *Bridge Magazine* is Michigan's leading provider of in-depth, data-driven, nonpartisan news and information.

- Hillside Middle School seventh grader **Natasha Kobelsky** placed an impressive third runner-up at the **Regional Spelling Bee competition** in February at the Charles H. Wright Museum in Detroit. Sponsored by WXYZ Channel 7, more than 70 spellers participated in the regional competition. Natasha was selected to represent Hillside at the Regional Spelling Bee after she emerged as the winner in an exciting school-wide competition of 13 students that stretched 35 rounds, with more than 140 words spelled. Natasha's words at the regional competition in order were: worrisome, flotilla, apostrophe, regime, gourami, oratorio, maelstrom, pentathlon, lederhosen, furlough, dichotomy, and kovsh. Amazing Natasha!



- Congratulations to the following NHS students who have placed in the top 100 in the state in the **Michigan Mathematics Prize Competition**: **Allen Ho**, **Pranav Meka**, **Daniel Tian**, **Timothy Wu**, and **Jeffrey Zhang**. They have been invited to a banquet on Saturday, March 10 where they will receive their final scores and possible scholarship awards. Well done!!

- Art students from **Northville High School** and second graders from **Winchester Elementary School** recently joined forces on an **Empty Bowls** project benefiting Northville Civic Concern. Students from the two schools partnered to create beautiful ceramic bowls, complete with ceramic glaze. School families and community members were invited to Winchester to enjoy a delicious meal (provided by Genitti's) and had the opportunity to select one of the handmade ceramic bowls, all while helping those in need in our own community. Special thanks to art teachers Jennifer Rohrhoff (Winchester) and Judy Cavanaugh (NHS) for coordinating this event, Genitti's for providing the food, our talented art students for providing these incredible works of art, and all the donors who made the event such a success.

- Kudos to the Northville High School **DECA** team for its outstanding performance at the State Career Development Conference earlier this month in Detroit. Here is a summary of the results:
 - 84 NHS students took part in the state competition
 - 61 NHS students made it to the stage to claim a total of 134 medals (including two for either the Economics and/or Math test)
 - 35 students qualified to compete in the DECA National Competition in Atlanta, Georgia, in April, and 17 have been named alternates
 - 2 NHS DECA students have been elected as Michigan State Officers and will attend the EMPOWER Academy while in Atlanta.



I also want to take this opportunity to share that the school-based enterprise at NHS (The N Den) is among 391 school-based enterprises in the United States achieving Gold Level certification this year. NHS juniors who worked on the certification, **Will Howe** and **Carlos Visconti**, will be recognized at the national conference.

- Great news from our winter sports teams, with the NHS **Gymnastics Team** making the podium as state runner-up and the **Boys Swim Team** placing an amazing fifth in the state. Our **Girls Basketball Team** had a great season, hitting their peak as district champions, and the **Competitive Cheer Team** earned regional qualifier honors while also racking up the highest GPA in the state among Division 1 schools and taking **Academic All-State Team** honors for the second straight year.





- Northville students showed off their artistic talents recently at the 2018 Scholastic Art Awards in February and at the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program Art Show earlier this week. The Scholastic Art Award winners included junior Maddi Cadaret, senior Rina Kishida, sophomore Geon Park, senior Alec Plymale, sophomore Saima Siddiqui, senior Diane Tian and junior Aiden Torres.
- The NHS Mock Trial Club took third place in the 2018 Michigan Mock Trial Regional Tournament in Grand Rapids. This is a major accomplishment, as the Northville Club, which formed two years ago, was competing against schools with 20 or more years of experience. This year's team includes seniors Serena Wang, Monica Jianette, Charlotte Beaudoin; juniors Lasys Marla, Dante Silva, Emily Eckenroth, and Savannah Manley; and sophomore Benjamin Levitt. Well done!
- Hillside Choirs Receive Top Ratings at Festivals! Encore and the combined 8th Grade Choir and 8th Grade Ensemble both received Division I "Excellent" ratings at District Choral Festival on Friday, March 23. The students worked hard to perfect their music and practice sight-reading. The choirs are rated in the categories of Tone Quality, Pitch, Rhythm, Diction, Interpretation, and Presentation, each having 4 separate indicators to be considered. The students also had to sight-read, which means they have to read a page of music they haven't seen before. As a result of these ratings, both choirs qualified for State Choral Festival which will take place on Friday, April 27 at Brighton High School. The 8th Grade Ensemble also rocked a perfect score at Solo & Ensemble Festival in Monroe last Saturday, a feat rarely achieved! Kudos Hillside Choirs!

- The Northville High School Bands had stellar performances at the District Band Festival in Ypsilanti earlier this month. Symphonic Band 10 earned First Divisions from all 4 judges and was awarded an overall First Division in Class B. The Symphonic Band 11/12 earned First Divisions from all 4 judges and was awarded an overall First Division in Class AA. Both bands will be performing at the MSBOA State Band Festival in May. The Symphonic Band 9 performed very well and earned a Second Division in class D. Congratulations to all of our NHS Band students!!!



- Thank You to all who participated in the 3rd Annual NPS Parent Camp on Saturday, March 24, 2018! We had over 150 in attendance for this annual learning opportunity!
