Goals and expectations for transitions

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Goals and expectations for transition:

1. Safety of students- physical and socially
2. Maintain comfort levels (class sizes)
3. Student success
4. Stay fiscally responsible

We looked at modular building plans and broke out into groups to discuss features. What came from each group-

1. Read Act if for K-3<sup>rd</sup> grade. Can we keep those grades together?
2. By only moving 5<sup>th</sup> grade to new building, it will not free up much space for growth.
3. Best to move 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grade to separate building. This will cause the least amount of disruption.
4. Move 6<sup>th</sup> grade out of middle school to allow for growth.
5. What is the bidding process?

Consensus of the group-

1. Move 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grade into separate building.
2. Put building where we can utilize existing water tap and electrical supply. (Where the old Charter School was)
3. Change the structure of the schools to – Primary- Kindergarten-3<sup>rd</sup> grade at elementary school, Intermediate- 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grades at new building, Middle school- 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade and High school -9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade.

2. Parking
3. Drop off and pick up
4. Fencing
5. Space between school for construction
6. Share Specials?
7. Extra staff and structure of administration
8. Covered walkway between school for safety and weather
9. SPED services
