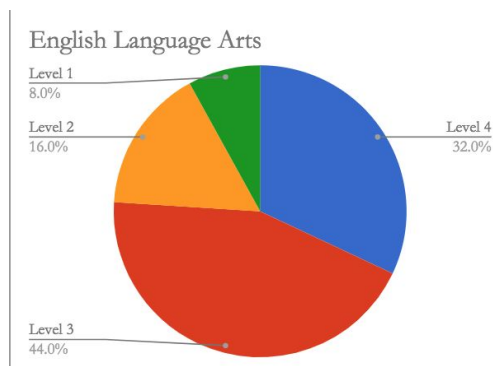

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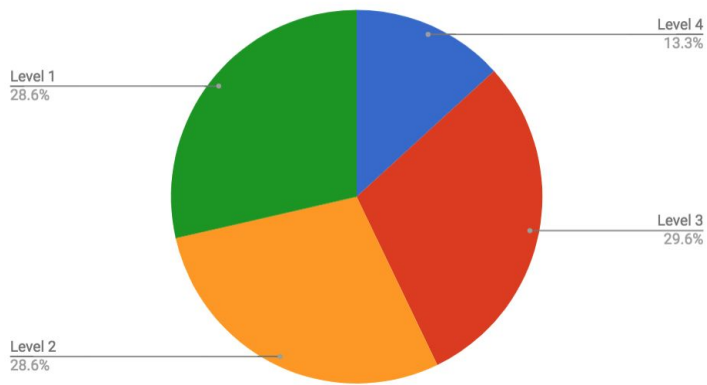

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### Grading

Grading is based on a 4-point scale. We assign letter grades of A-C, and NP (not-proficient). Students who earn a grade below a “C” are required to retake the course for high school credit and undergraduate college admissions. Student are assigned grades based solely on their individual mastery of course standards, as evident on assessments.

Alliance schools run on a semester calendar starting in August through June. Students engage in an academically challenging program that require all students to meet the University of California and California State University’s “A-G” undergraduate admission requirements. The curriculum is designed to prepare Alliance students for the challenges of college, as well as develop into successful and healthy adults.

Students at Neuwirth have the opportunity to take college courses at Los Angeles Trade Tech College (LATT) while in high school. Fall 2017 is offered two courses: Humanities and Music.
