What is the CAC?



The Community Advisory Committee is an advisory group which focuses on SELPA wide special education issues. It is an opportunity for volunteers from the school districts to provide input to the SELPA Local Plan.

CAC's Role

The primary responsibilities include, but are not limited to,

- Advise the SELPA regarding the development, amendment, and review of the Local Plan;
- Make recommendations on annual priorities to be addressed under the Local Plan;
- Encourage parent and community involvement in the development, implementation, and review of the Local Plan;
- Assist in parent education; and
- Support activities on behalf of individuals with exceptional needs.

CAC Membership

- Volunteers from each school district;
- Nominated by the Special Education Director;
- Appointed by the School District Board; and
- Serve a two year term.

All meetings are open to the public and everyone is warmly welcome to attend and participate. A collaborative atmosphere is encouraged through team building and sharing of information.

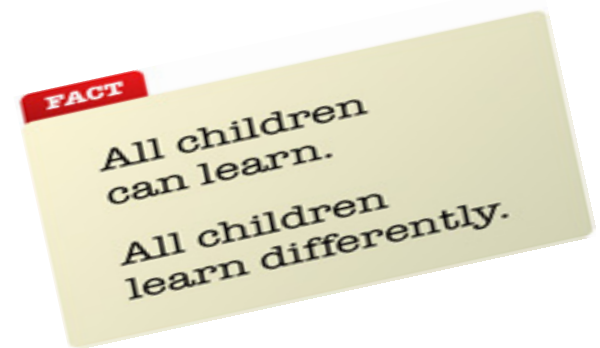
What can the CAC do for me?

The Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) is a consortium of local school districts and educational agencies located within a geographical region that are required to provide for all special education service needs of children within the regional boundaries. The special education services are developed and described in a Local Plan. The SELPA is dedicated to the belief that all students can learn and that special needs students must be guaranteed equal opportunity to become contributing members of society. The SELPA facilitates high quality educational programs and services for special needs children and training for parents and educators. The SELPA collaborates with county agencies and school districts to develop and maintain healthy and enriching environments in which special needs students and families can live and succeed.
