We introduced Randi Stuard, the new Coordinator for Live Long Van Zandt. Randi will be working with our P.E teachers so 5-2-1-0 can be introduced to our students. 5-2-1-0 has been discussed in previous SHAC meetings.

Suzanne Long, the Contract Manager for SSC Service Solutions, the company that provides our custodial needs, talked to us about soap and soap dispensers. Suzanne will be implementing a system where bathrooms and soap dispensers are checked and signed off on several times a day to ensure that soap dispensers have soap available at all times and dispensers are functioning. We discussed the possibility of switching the dispensers to motion sensitive electric ones. Suzanne stated that she believes that it is in her budget to buy one at a time to be placed in the highest priority area first and continue replacing them on a rotation basis for our campuses.

Suzanne also informed us of the measures they take for Staph infection prevention. SSC Service Solutions use Virex spray. Virex kills everything that bleach does on surface areas safely. Virex is health friendly concerning skin and respiratory reactions. Virex is used on surfaces throughout our campuses including: desktops, door knobs and water fountains.

John Norrell and I will be instructing our elementary and intermediate students on the proper handwashing techniques during their P.E. classes. We will stress the importance of handwashing in preventing illnesses.
