Academic Pentathlon Heads to Nationals

Twenty-five students from East and West Junior High School recently competed in the state Academic Pentathlon competition. Our Gold team placed 1st in Tennessee and 4th nationally; our Blue Team placed 3rd in Tennessee and 10th nationally.
