What can you do to help your child stay on the path to positive behavior?

- Review the SOAR core values with your child.
- Ask your child about his/her day at school everyday
- Make sure your child is ready everyday. Ensure a good night's sleep.
- Provide quiet time and space for your child to do homework nightly
- Keep in touch with your child's teacher
- Encourage your child to use appropriate language and tone.
- Practice positive phrases with your child such as "Thank You" and "Excuse Me"
- If you have any behavior concerns, please contact your child's teacher first. He/she has daily contact with your child and their classmates, and can quickly and effectively address any concerns.

Positive Behavior Interventions & Support

What is a positive Behavior Intervention & Supports (PBIS)

Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports is a process for creating school environments that are more predictable and effective for achieving academic and social goals. PBIS will enhance our current systems and practices and change our culture for the better.

We need you!

Parents are an important part of PBIS implementation. We encourage parents to use the same expectations and rules that the school teaches. This common language creates consistency and a unified support for expected student behavior. Parents are asked to please discuss the common rules and expectations at home. Children thrive when they have consistent, predictable expectations and consequences.

Discipline

Most student behavior will be managed in the classroom by the teacher. Behavior infractions will be recorded on the student's classroom discipline form and the parent will be notified after two infractions of the same behavior.

Classroom managed behaviors include: cheating, classroom disruptions, dishonesty, disrespect, non-directed inappropriate language, rude/ disrespectful actions, teasing, uncooperative behavior.

Intervention and response strategies for classroom managed behaviors include but are not limited to verbal correction, apology, conference with the student, modeling appropriate behavior, loss of privilege, parent contact.

A complete discipline form (3 behaviors) will result in an office referral.

Some infractions will result in an immediate office referral.

Office managed behaviors are assault, directed use of profanity, fighting/ physical aggressiveness, harassment/bullying, inappropriate touching, possession of weapon or illegal substance.
