## Minutes of Regular Meeting

April 25, 2013

The Garvey Board of Education met in regular session on April 25, 2013, at the Garvey Auditorium, 2720 N. Jackson Avenue, Rosemead, California.

**CALL TO ORDER**

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m., by Board President Tony Ramos.

**ROLL CALL**

Present at the meeting were Mr. Bob Bruesch, Ms. M. Janet Chin, Mr. Henry Lo, Mr. Tony Ramos, Mr. John Yuen (arrived at 6:35 p.m.), and Superintendent Dr. Sandra Johnson.

Also in attendance were Mr. Genaro Alarcon, Mr. Robert McEntire, Dr. Mary Suzuki, and Ms. Maria De La Cruz.

**VISITORS PRESENT**

Present as visitors were the persons listed on the attached Register of Attendance who signed the register and whose signatures were legible and which is hereby made an official part of these minutes.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG**

Mr. Bob Bruesch led the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance. The Board held a moment of silence in memory of the victims from the recent Boston Marathon and West Texas explosions.

**SPECIAL RECOGNITION**

Dr. Wendy Molina-Solis addressed the Board regarding actions taken that led to the award of Dewey School – Title I as a Academic Achieving School in 2013. Dr. Molina-Solis spoke of the many student activities and learning strategies implemented this year in order to help students with specific learning needs. These activities included learning walks, professional development, and various data analysis that addressed the support needed by staff and students. Dr. Molina-Solis thanked the Dewey staff and parents for their efforts for students throughout the year. A certificate of recognition was presented to Dewey School staff for this recent school award.

**COMMUNICATIONS/REPORTS FROM THE BOARD AND SUPERINTENDENT**

Dr. Sandra Johnson reminded the Board that Sanchez was also honored last year and Willard the year before for being awarded a Title I Achieving School.

Dr. Johnson stated that this week she and Carolyn Wong met with Keisha Woods, Director of Head Start, L.A. County Office of Education (LACOE), and at the meeting, we were informed that we will be fully funded next year, except for Federal cuts of five percent. In addition, Garvey was given \$100,000 by LACOE to address some of our facility needs, including replacement of playground and padding at some of our school sites.

Dr. Johnson informed the Board about the testing one restroom at Sanchez for asbestos. The tests results were well below appropriate levels as confirmed this morning by an outside agency. The bathroom will undergo asbestos abatement this weekend and be open by Tuesday. Dr. Johnson thanked all the participants to the beautification day, administrators, teachers, Rosemead City staff, children and parents, who made some good improvements at the schools. There were lots of photos taken at this event that will be posted on the Web pages.

Dr. Johnson announced a grant that was recently awarded to purchase Success Maker curriculum that was evaluated by our teachers to better serve our students. The grant will total about \$300,000 to \$500,000 depending on how much the District can afford for the required ten percent match. This grant is worth far more than we will pay our grant writer.

Bob Bruesch stated he visited four schools at their open house and also visited five schools during Beautification Day. Mr. Bruesch spoke of a recent breakfast held by Rosemead City staff to discuss the Young American Music Program that is seeking to work with our students in the near future. Mr. Bruesch stated he has already collected donations of \$2,000 to support our students. Mr. Bruesch indicated that he contacted CSBA regarding Administrative Regulation - AR 1213.1 – regarding due process regulations that includes four steps in the complaint procedures. Mr. Bruesch asked that this matter be placed in the next Board agenda.

Henry Lo indicated that he had an opportunity to attend the school open houses at Sanchez, Monterey Vista, and Hillcrest Schools. Mr. Lo commended the dedicated students and parents who came out to see the student displays and the progress being made by students. Mr. Lo gave his best wishes to Lt. Tim Murakami who has acted as police chief/captain in Rosemead Safety Office. Mr. Murakami has built a strong relationship between the Sheriff's Department, the City of Rosemead, and our District on public safety issues.

Janet Chin spoke of a recent press release regarding Senate President Pro Tempore Darrell Steinberg talking about the Governor's policy position, giving the outline of Senate Bill 69-Local Control Funding Formula to ensure all student programs are well funded. This would bring all districts to the state level funding prior to State cuts. Ms. Chin hopes that at the next Board meeting a report is given on this funding.

Bob Bruesch spoke of an editorial column he and two other educators will be writing on how the Governor's funding will help our children meet the Common Core Standards with vocabulary, literacy and the extra help needed for English learner students.

Tony Ramos talked about the last special Board meeting/workshop regarding the District's vision statement and the need to schedule another special Board meeting/workshop to continue working on the vision statement. Mr. Ramos thanked Mr. Chow for past Friday's hiking trip where 72 students participated in outdoor activities.

## REPORTS AND INFORMATION ITEMS

- A. John Isom, on behalf of Greg Isom, Isom Advisors, gave a report on Bond/Parcel Tax Survey Results. He shared results of the survey given to 400 registered voters from 19,340 registered voters. The survey questions will help determine if there is a high potential vote in November 2013 for a bond or parcel tax. The survey took place from March 19 through April 16, 2013 with questions regarding the feasibility of a school funding for general obligation bonds or parcel tax. Mr. Isom listed the results and threshold for each of the survey questions regarding the bond, parcel tax, or both bond and parcel tax. **Mr. Isom stated that based on the survey data and likelihood of a positive vote on November 2013, he did not think that the District should pursue a parcel tax until maybe in June 2014.**
- B. Mr. Hing Chow gave a report from Community Advisory Council (CAC) Representatives.

Mr. Chow stated that the Council met this Monday and approved the Local Plan for the SELPA. The Council Bylaws are in the process of being approved. At the Council meeting there was a guest speaker Ms. Kasey Suki, director of Open Doors Now who talked about this organization providing a forum for parents of students with autism and what parents can do for the students' education working in partnership with the school district. Mr. Chow provided the Council with the 211 brochures sent from Senator Hernandez' Office as an aid to seeking many kinds of counseling, even finding shelter and food banks. A Council subcommittee will be working to develop packets of information for Special Education parents that will include a list of resources. The Council is working on a one-page flyer listing the Council's mission and purpose.

## REPORT FROM UNION REPRESENTATIVES

- Garvey Education Association (GEA)

Michael Drange, president of GEA, addressed the Board regarding GEA's no-confidence vote. Mr. Drange stated there are continuous efforts to silence GEA members. Mr. Drange introduced several individuals from other districts and CTA. Mr. Drange thanked them all for attending tonight's Board meeting.

Erick Heins, Vice President of California Teachers Association, addressed the Board regarding the lack of harmonious collaboration between labor and management. Mr. Heins stated that their members are watching the Board proceedings and he asked Board members to do what is right for the children and employees in the District.

- **California School Employees Association (CSEA)**

Olivia De Leon, president of CSEA, Chapter 292, indicated that CSEA is still working on negotiations. She spoke of volunteers doing union work at a school library, and the response from the District. Ms. De Leon spoke of the Memorandum of Understanding for early notification of retirement. Ms. De Leon hopes that the employee notifications comply with the 60 day notification (not 45 days) as has been the traditional practice. Ms. De Leon noted the upcoming celebrations of Classified Employee Week on May 20-24, 2012, and the end-of year celebration on the week of June 8, 2013.

### **REPORT FROM HEAD START REPRESENTATIVE**

Carolyn Wong, Director of Head Start/State Preschool, gave a report on the non-Federal Share totaling \$95,308.50 that includes 4868 volunteer hours (Policy Committee, volunteers and in-kind donations) for 29 classrooms. Ms. Wong spoke of the cleared monitoring report items on volunteer hours having the necessary clearances and our employees and volunteers signing a standard of conduct form. Ms. Wong stated the Head Start Program is now collecting fees for State Preschool students. Fifteen hours of professional growth is needed per year. Staff is working on facility improvements and a response will be completed by the end of this month. Recordkeeping is being done to ensure detailed files on enrollment and the timely processing of files. The Head Start Program is fully enrolled and there is an ongoing recruitment and selection effort.

Ms. Wong reported that Head Start materials have been accepted for a national accreditation from the National Association for Education of Young Children with an anticipated visit by the end of June 30, 2013 for this national recognition.

Ms. Wong is working on the State Program self evaluation to be submitted in May, 2013. The March 2013 summary report included:

- 1 vacancy in enrollment
- 4,493 breakfasts
- 7,190 lunches
- 4,265 snacks
- Average Daily Attendance was at 91.21 percent.
- The next Policy Committee meeting will be on May 15, 2013, 9:00 a.m.

Ms. Wong commented on a one-time grant of \$100,000 that is being pursued for specific health and safety issues.

Dr. Sandra Johnson stated that the LACOE Head Start director shared her appreciation for the fine work that Carolyn Wong is doing in clearing non-compliance items and completing all the record-keeping requirements.

Janet Chin asked about the one-time grant for health and safety. Ms. Wong indicated that per LACOE's recommendation, the work will involve surfacing underneath the playground structure and surfacing at Dewey and replacing the surfacing at Duff School's two play ground structures, in addition to re-asphalting the ground level.

### **REPORTS FROM DISTRICT REPRESENTATIVES**

- **Garvey Council PTA: None**

- **Garvey Education Foundation**

Bob Bruesch stated he hopes the Foundation Board is hoping to use some of the money to help kids get involved in the Young American Music Program.

#### **HEARING OF PERSONS IN THE AUDIENCE**

Ted Saulino addressed the Board regarding his opinion on a staff reassignment to the principal at Temple School. He stated that the former principal of Dewey School pulled the school out of Program Improvement and the new principal and all the teachers are working hard to move Dewey School forward. Mr. Saulino gave reasons for supporting the recall of a Board Member and the District's likelihood of passing a bond or a parcel tax.

Julian De La Torre, president of Montebello Teachers Association, addressed the Board regarding the many legislative initiatives that have been passed in cooperation with other union organizations at the State and national levels and his concern about what he hears is happening to Garvey teachers. He asked Board members to seek a common ground and to not hurt public education.

Sandra O'Brien addressed the Board regarding Special Education bus drop off being changed to the front of Temple Intermediate School. Ms. O'Brien stated that this change poses a safety issue for all Special Education students. Ms. O'Brien offered to open the back gate and lock it to let three busses. Ms. O'Brien spoke of an after school program being allowed to park and enter through the back gate while neither staff nor students are allowed. Ms. O'Brien stated that these classrooms being mistreated and destroyed.

Cathie Camacho addressed the Board regarding two pictures of former principal Roger Temple that were thrown away when Dr. Sandra was acting as principal when principal. Camacho indicated that her mother would like to have the two pictures returned or put back at Temple Intermediate School.

Raquel Galan addressed the Board regarding Consent Agenda Item A.7 – Resolution 12-1324 – National Teacher Appreciation Week, calling the hypocritical. Ms. Galan spoke of recently being pulled from the classroom regarding the Rosemead City Council election of March 5, 2013. Ms. Galan stated she felt offended by this and that her civil rights were being violated.

Patricia Kasababian addressed the Board regarding District-level administrators conducting inspections of all campus facilities with an emphasis on classrooms and a focus on eliminating "clutter" from the rooms. Ms. Kasababian stated that she understood many items at Temple Intermediate School had been put in the trash.

Dr. Roz Collier addressed the Board stating that No Fear has prepared a statement on behalf of GEA which she read aloud.

Larry Chang addressed the Board stating that at the recent open house of Monterey Vista School, he did not see Dr. Sandra Johnson, nor John Yuen, Janet Chin, and Tony Ramos. Mr. Chang stated that he did see Bob Bruesch, Henry Lo, and Genaro Alarcon. Mr. Chang stated that attendance at these school functions are an opportunity to assure staff that "things are heading in the right direction." Mr. Chang stated that he is nervous about where our District is headed. Mr. Chang talked about issues related to the recall election and the directive from Dr. Johnson on "no confidence" buttons.

Janet Chin addressed some of the issues brought up by the speakers tonight stating that the estimated cost of a recall election is about \$210,000. She stated that after learning that the Foundation has access to school keys, even though she does not deal in the Foundation's operations, she will look into this matter. Ms. Chin thanked the community that supported her during the recent Rosemead City Council election. Ms. Chin stated her continued support for our students and the community.

Dr. Sandra Johnson clarified a number of issues that were brought up tonight. She stated that the principal issuing a school key to the M. Janet Chin Foundation and to Woodcraft Rangers was inappropriate; the District dealt with this and

the keys were taken back and the locks were re-keyed. Dr. Johnson stated that there is absolutely no truth to any records or facility bills being falsified. The M. Janet Chin Foundation, like any other organization has been paying the correct amount and that the books are open if anybody wishes to review them. Dr. Johnson stated there have been complaints about safety issues when the back gate at Temple is open because parents drive through the back field when students are present. Dr. Johnson stated that no pictures of Roger Temple were thrown out; other items were relocated to the school library for safe keeping. Dr. Johnson stated that sometimes two open houses are scheduled on the same night, and Board and cabinet members have to divide their time to attend the open houses on the same night. Dr. Johnson indicated that the statement from our attorney regarding the buttons is to protect the children's rights of not having their education disrupted.

Bob Bruesch indicated he was involved in a UCLA team developing the Common Core Standards and which there will be an editorial in the ~~Los Angeles Times tomorrow~~ by the California School Boards Association (CSBA) **Magazine**. The editorial is about what schools have already done to implement this new way of teaching. Mr. Bruesch expressed anger that our implementation of the Common Core Standards is behind schedule. Mr. Bruesch asked for a Board discussion to explain why the District is so far behind on this new way of teaching that he is totally in favor of. Dr. Mary Suzuki shared documentation that shows the extensive work of academic coaches and teachers on Common Core Standards since 2012.

#### **MOTION TO EXTEND THE MEETING**

On the motion of Janet Chin, seconded by Bob Bruesch, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board extended the meeting to 12 Midnight.

#### **MOTION TO GO INTO CLOSED SESSION**

On the motion of Henry Lo, seconded by John Yuen, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board adjourned at 8:42 p.m., to closed session and addressed those items posted on the agenda.

#### **RECONVENE INTO PUBLIC SESSION**

The Board reconvened in public at 9:50 p.m.

Tony Ramos indicated that no action was taken during closed session.

On the motion of Bob Bruesch, seconded by Janet Chin, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board adopted Resolution No. 12-13-24 proclaiming May 5-11, 2013 as National Teacher Appreciation Week in the Garvey School District, as revised.

Bob Bruesch made a revision to 3<sup>rd</sup> paragraph adding, “. . .honors teachers for their efforts and professionalism.”

8. Accept Donation  
It is recommended that the Board of Education accept a donation from Garvey Council PTA in the amount of \$375.00 for the District's County Math Field Day Registration. Accepted.
9. Approve Employment Contracts  
On the motion of Janet Chin, seconded by Tony Ramos, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board approved. employment contract for the following positions:

  - Assistant Superintendent, Learning Support Services (2013-2015)
  - Chief Business Officer (2013-2015)
10. Fundraising Activity  
It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the sale of snack food Items by Temple ASB to be held on Monday, April 29 after school and Monday, May 27, 2013 after school. Item pulled, not approved.

Dr. Sandra Johnson stated that staff has been working hard to ensure that there are no future audit items in the Associated Student Body fundraising process. Dr. Johnson asked Board members if they wish to see these fundraising activities come to the Board for approval. The law also allows the superintendent to approve these activities.

Tony Ramos suggested having a calendar of fundraising activities and a policy where these would not be in conflict with each other. Janet Chin felt that the Superintendent can approve these requests.

Robert McEntire stated that the District is planning to centralize the fiscal side of the ASB accounts and standardize the bookkeeping process. The Board agreed to bring to the Board only those activities of concern or controversy and allow the Superintendent to approve these requests.

**B. Human Resources**

1. Personnel Assignment Order - Revised

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the Personnel Assignment Report No. 12-13-15 as presented. Approved

**C. Learning Support Services**

1. YMCA Camp Surf – Rice School

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the attendance of eighty sixth grade students, three teachers and six parent chaperones from Rice School to attend the YMCA Camp Surf in San Diego from May 29 through May 31, 2013. Approved.

2. YMCA Camp Surf – Willard School

It is recommended that the Board of Education ratify the attendance of forty-two sixth grade students and four chaperones from Willard Elementary School to attend an outdoor education program at YMCA Camp Surf from April 24 through April 26, 2013. Approved.

3. Ratify Contract with Parent Institute for Quality Education (PIQE)

It is recommended that the Board of Education ratify a contract with the Parent Institute for Quality Education (PIQE) to provide a parent training course to Temple Intermediate School parents from October 10 through December 12, 2012. Approved.

4. Contract with Devereux Texas Treatment Network

It is recommended that the Board ratify a contract with Devereux Texas Treatment Network, a residential treatment facility that provides mental health, non-public school instruction as well as room and board. Contract effective March 1 through June 30, 2013. Approved.

5. Contract with Education Spectrum

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve a contract with Education Spectrum from April 26, 2013 until June 30, 2013 to complete an Independent Educational Evaluation (IEE). Approved.

**D. Business Services**

1. Purchase Order Report

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve Purchase Order Report No.12-13-14 as presented. Approved.

2. Appropriation Transfers

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the Appropriation Transfers as presented. Approved.

3. Resolution 12-13-25 – Approving the Purchase of Electronic Data Processing Goods and Services from DI Technology Group, Inc., D.B.A. Data Impressions

It is recommended that the Board of Education adopt Resolution No. 12-13-25 to allow the District to take advantage of pre-negotiated pricing with Data Impressions under the California Multiple Award Schedule (CMAS).

Bob Bruesch asked about the percentage of purchases under this resolution. Mr. McEntire stated that the percentage is very small and that this company is competitive for its purchases with a faster turnaround on items to be acquired before June 30, 2013.

Bob Bruesch moved, Tony Ramos seconded, to approve Consent Item No. D.3. as presented.

Bob Bruesch asked that the same type of consortium be combined with other sources to ensure that the same type of process is done with other vendors.

### Action Items

On the motion of Henry Lo, seconded by Janet Chin, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board waived the District's policy regarding disclosure of the student's name in public for Action Item A.

A. Expulsion

On the motion of Bob Bruesch, seconded by Henry Lo, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board approved the recommendation to expel student 12-13-04 from the School District for a period ending June 14, 2013. The student is a 6th grader at Rice Elementary School, for violation of the following:

Education Code 48900(C) unlawfully possessed, used, sold, or otherwise furnished, or been under the influence of a controlled substance.

On the motion of Henry Lo, seconded by Bob Bruesch, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board approved the recommendation to suspend the expulsion, evidence must be provided of meeting the rehabilitation plan by June 14, 2013.

B. Board Policy 5131.2-Bullying

On the motion of Henry Lo, seconded by Tony Ramos, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board approved the second reading and adoption of new Board Policy 5131.2 - Bullying.

C. Board Policy/Administrative Regulations 3260 – Fees and Charges

Bob Bruesch moved, Janet Chin seconded to approve the First Reading of BP3260 and AR3260 (Fees and Charges).

Janet Chin asked about fees charged for student laptops. Dr. Mary Suzuki indicated that the charges for laptops are for insurance to cover loss or theft and that it is not refundable. Dr. Sandra Johnson stated that the laptop insurance charges are similar to the athletics liability charges.

The Board deferred approval of the first reading of Action Item C.

D. Board Policy and Administrative Regulations 7214 – General Obligation Bond

On the motion of Janet Chin, seconded by Tony Ramos, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board adopted the First Reading BP7214 and AR7214 (General Obligation Bonds).

E. HIV Prevention Curriculum

On the motion of Bob Bruesch, seconded by John Yuen, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board adopted the Keeping Safe from HIV-A School-Based HIV Prevention Curriculum for Middle and High School Students.

Dr. Mary Suzuki indicated that parents have a right to opt-out of the curriculum. Letters are sent two weeks before to let parents know they can preview the materials. Dr. Sandra Johnson stated that under the law, the



District has a legal obligation to provide an alternative curriculum and this would not affect student grades. The District is fully prepared to do that.

F. Adopt Envision Common Core Mathematics Materials

On the motion of Henry Lo, seconded by Bob Bruesch, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board adopted the K-2 Envision Common Core Mathematics Materials for 2013-2014.

G. Los Angeles County School Trustees (LACSTA)

It is recommended that the Board of Education instruct LACSTA's Board Representative (John Yuen) to cast votes for Nominees for Directors 1-5, and President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer of the Executive Board of the Association. (The Association will also accept verbal nominations at the meeting.)

Janet Chin stated that there was only one candidate per position. Ms. Chin and Bob Bruesch have opted not to run for office this year. The LACSTA dinner will be on May 20, 2013, at the Proud Bird, Los Angeles Airport.

On the motion of Janet Chin, seconded by Tony Ramos, and carried by a vote of 5 to 0, the Board approved Action Item G. as presented.

H. Establishment of Surplus Property Committee

Henry Lo moved, Bob Bruesch seconded, to approve the Surplus Property Committee.

Dr. Sandra Johnson addressed the qualifications of the individuals interested in serving on the Surplus Property Committee and clarified the term limits for committee members.

The motion carried by a vote of 5 to 0.

**PUBLIC AGENDA ITEMS: None**

The Board adjourned the meeting in memory of Oscar Calderon, husband of Christine Calderon, Head Start teacher, and in memory of the victims of the Boston Marathon explosions, and the MIT security officer that was recently shot.

**FUTURE MEETINGS**

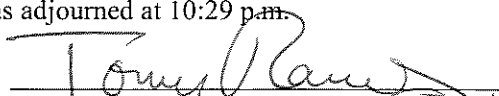

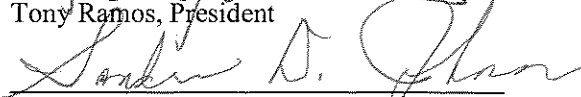
