### 1. Welcome and Thanks for Being Here!

### Follow Up Items:

2. Approve January Minutes Megan Hansen motioned to approve, Maria Whitworth seconded, motion carried by unanimous vote
3. Choir Concert in May – May 15<sup>th</sup> (after SAGE testing) at Grantsville High School
4. Food Resources for Students in Need – District will follow through on this project; school will re-address during summer if needed
5. Scholastic Book Fair and Guest Reader Day: Book Fair grossed almost \$11,000. Will purchase bookshelves and lap tops. Guest Reader Day: About 200 students had no guests attend Discussed Dr. Seuss dress-up days, next year will have two theme weeks
6. 90 Day Plan: Student Thinking, Learning, and Sharing: After teacher evaluations, administrators have enjoyed asking students what they are learning and how they know they are learning it. Recess banners are hung on the playground.
7. Counselor: Dylan Lines is here Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday. Does individual, group, conflict management, social, prevention, etc. counseling. Anti-bullying assembly for 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> grades Discussion: Anyone who talks to Mr. Lines needs parent approval unless advice is about academic/organizational skills. ### New Items:

8. Extra Community Council Funds from this Year: \$3000 was added to 2017-18 Trustlands funding. These funds are allocated to purchase technology (laptops). There will also be unused funds from payroll. Maria Whitworth motioned to approve using these funds to purchase laptops also. Jennifer Critchlow seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously. Current laptops are in continuous use for reports, Utah Compose and other projects.
9. Community Council Funds for Next Year: Aides per Grade Level
