


## 2 Farewell from Fr. Chris

OLA has been a spiritual home for me for many years, as I've journeyed through life. It's time to say good-bye for now, but I leave with many friendships and memories which I will cherish for years to come.

I first arrived at OLA in 1977, attending Mass while studying at Webb School. Some years later, after completing my university studies in 1987, I became a seminarian for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. OLA was my home parish as a seminarian, and so on vacations from the seminary, I would live in the rectory and help out around the parish. When I was ordained a priest in 1992, I celebrated my first Mass here at OLA at the 11 a.m. Mass.



Since that time I have served in six other parishes in the archdiocese, and in 2009 came to OLA and began my service here as an associate pastor. The years have flown by, and I have tried to do my best to serve this community in a variety of ways, including working with the Spanish-speaking community in their different ministries.

I'm now at the point where my health is not so good, specifically issues of not sleeping well and at times having difficulty breathing. The sleep has been a problem for many years and the breathing is a more recent problem, but I believe that it is time for me to take a leave of absence and deal with these issues, for the sake of my future service to the archdiocese. I will be reassigned shortly to another parish where I will be in residence for a time, and then, God willing that I get better soon, resume my ministry there.

This has been my favorite parish as a priest; OLA will always have a special place in my heart. I hope I have found a place in your heart, so that you might pray for me for healing. God bless you.





## Guidelines for Fasting and Abstinence in Lent

In an earlier era, the emphasis during Lent was on sacrifice, fasting and repentance. Today, our Lenten experience continues to emphasize personal sacrifice and soul-searching, but it is also a time for spiritual growth, acts of mercy and preparations for the great feast of Easter!

Catholics 18-59 years of age in good health must fast (only one full meal) on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics age 14 and older must abstain from meat Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

During Lent, we will "fast" from noise and observe ten minutes of silence prior to Mass. The assembly will be dismissed in silence with a bell, but no hymn.

## Operation Rice Bowl





## Reflection on Ash Wednesday

Joel 2:12-18; Psalm 51:3-417; 2 Corinthians 5:20-6:2; Matthew 6:1-6, 16-18. Today, and the days that follow until Sunday, we take small steps in prayer and reflection, and take stock of our strengths and weaknesses. Are we prepared for the Lenten journey? Once again, we are marked with ashes in a public sign of penitence after the proclamation of the Gospel and the homily during the Ash Wednesday liturgy. We return to the Lord with our whole heart, with our whole mind, and all our strength. With great trust, we turn ourselves over to God. Once again, we open our closed hearts to God, who showers mercy upon his people. The trumpet blast calls us all; no one is excluded. As our brows are marked with the sign of mortality – the dust of last year's palms making a smudge of a cross on our skin – we pledge to repent and be faithful to the Gospel. In many monastic communities, the monks go up to receive their ashes barefoot, a sign of humility. Imagine how this simple, barefoot state might feel, both today and again on Good Friday when we approach the Cross for adoration. This Cross is a sign of suffering, but also of Christ's victory over sin and death.
