Heads Up About Head Lice

The school has been notified of many cases of head lice this school year. Recently, I have been notified of cases in kindergarten, second, fourth, fifth, seventh and eighth grade and some of the children use our before and after school care services.

All schools are struggling with this issue. We recommend checking your child for head lice every week. If you notice your child seems to be scratching their head a lot, it is definitely time to do a thorough head check. Please refer to the attached sheet for more helpful information and what to do if you find head lice.

Head lice are passed from person to person by direct contact or on shared objects. So, you may want to encourage your child to keep these things to him or herself and to refrain from

hugging and touching other children's hair. Encouraging your child to keep their coats and sweaters in their backpack when they are not wearing them may be helpful.

Please notify the school if you have found head lice on anyone in your family. Children can return to school once they have been treated and hair has been thoroughly combed to remove nits.

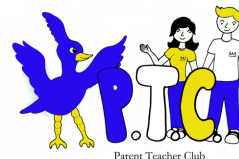
