Agenda: Jay Tullos (Superintendent, CISD) presented information regarding a program, Teens in the Driver Seat, in an effort to bring awareness to texting and driving. Teens in the Driver Seat is a student led program that addresses risk factors that are involved with teens behind the wheel in combination with driver inexperience, such as fatigue, speeding, distractions, not wearing a seat belt, and drug/alcohol use. Accident statistics were presented along with this impactful statement concerning teen fatalities caused by motor vehicle accidents: It's like commercial airliners full of teens crashing every other week.

We also addressed plans to choose a sex education curriculum for our Junior High students to be presented at the next SHAC meeting.

Agenda: Stephanie Hanks- Wynne (Counselor, Canton Junior High) presented information about the preferred sex education curriculum for our 6th, 7th and 8th grade students. Canton ISD has purchased the Scott and White Worth the Wait (S&W WTW) sex education curriculum for review and to present to the School Board. S&W WTW is the most used sexual health curriculum by Texas school districts. S&W WTW is a trusted and valued name in sex education. WTW is a scientific, abstinence based curriculum. We intend to teach the program in May after all STAAR testing has been completed. The curriculum is very user friendly, as well as grade appropriate, meeting students at their level of understanding. WTW emphasizes maintaining a healthy body as well as a healthy emotion well-being. S&W WTW will be presented to the School Board for approval, Monday, April 16th.

Also discussed: The Health Department will be providing our district with an Immunization Clinic, August 2nd, 2012 from 4:00 PM – 6:00 PM at the Junior High campus. This clinic is for students that do not have health insurance. The immunizations will be \$8.00 each.

Incoming 7th graders must be up to date on all shots including Varicella (Chicken Pox), Tdap booster, and Menactra (meningococcal) immunizations by the first day of school to attend Texas schools and be in compliance with State Law.
