The Garvey Board of Education met in regular session on May 14, 2015, at the Education Center, 2730 N. Del Mar Ave., Rosemead, California. Later, the meeting was moved to Bitely School 7501 E. Fern Avenue, Rosemead, California.

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m., by Board President Henry Lo.

RECONVENE INTO PUBLIC SESSION

The Board reconvened in public at 7:15 p.m.

REPORT OF ACTION TAKEN IN CLOSED SESSION

Henry Lo indicated there was no action taken during closed session. Mr. Lo called for a recess in order to reconvene the meeting at Bitely School.

RECONVENE FROM RECESS INTO PUBLIC SESSION

The Board reconvened from recess into public session at 7:45 p.m.

COMMUNICATIONS/REPORTS FROM THE BOARD AND SUPERINTENDENT

- **Student Presentation – Monterey Vista School**

Principal Hing Chow of Monterey Vista School introduced several students from teacher Ken Tang's class. The students led by Sue Byard sang a *7 Habits* song tuned to *Ten Little Indians*.

- **Other Communications/Reports**

Anita Chu reported that the schools have been busy preparing for the last day of school and finishing the new Smarter Balanced assessments. At the same time, the District will have a productive summer with an extensive summer school for about 1,000 students and a series of professional development sessions to prepare staff for the new year. Ms. Chu stated that about 800 laptops are being deployed to Garvey and Temple Intermediate Schools for the English language arts and mathematics classrooms to bring the schools closer to a 21st Century learning environment.

Janet Chin commented on an event, "Annie Musical" performed by Temple Intermediate School, and on a Rhythmax Choir performance that will take place on May 29, 2015, at Rice School. Ms. Chin invited all parents to attend a water conservation educational forum that will take place on May 19, 2015 at 2:45 p.m., at Brightwood Elementary School in Monterey Park; she spoke of a \$2000 donation from the San Gabriel Water District for water education.

Bob Bruesch spoke about May being an awareness month for foster children, and how our District is impacted with a high number of foster children, some which have special needs. Mr. Bruesch indicated he is pleased to see that Governor Brown has ensured that part of our LCAP funding will help these students. Mr. Bruesch stated he visited all the open houses. He commented that there are not enough substitute teachers and he asked for a comparison of substitute teacher salaries in the San Gabriel Valley schools.

Henry Lo reminded everyone of the upcoming Garvey Education Foundation annual dinner on May 27, 2015, at Luminarias Restaurant, to raise money to supplement extra-curricular programs. Mr. Lo indicated that the Board of San Gabriel Municipal Water District has approved a donation of \$2,000 to the Garvey Education Foundation for water conservation projects.

REPORT FROM UNION REPRESENTATIVES

- **Garvey Education Association (GEA)**

Michael Drange, President of Garvey Education Association, gave a Power Point presentation regarding the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) revenue which is divided into a base grant, supplemental grant, and concentration grant. The funds are provided to support eight State priorities that need to be addressed in the Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP). Mr. Drange indicated that the L.A. Unified District has determined to use the supplemental and concentration grants to pay for teacher salary increases.

- **California School Employees Association (CSEA): None**

Olivia De Leon addressed the Board regarding a celebration of CSEA Week next week at Garvey Ranch Park on May 22, 2015. Ms. De Leon gave an update on CSEA negotiations, stating that members are asking for a salary increase, the recognition of Cesar Chavez holiday, a longevity increase, and an additional salary increase for Head Start Teachers.

REPORT FROM HEAD START REPRESENTATIVE

Carolyn Wong, Director of State Head Start/State Preschool Program, addressed the Board regarding a Grantee visit to review the educational services files and to conduct classroom monitoring for the implementation of a new curriculum. Enrollment for disability students is at 9 percent out of 10 percent required for students enrolled in special needs classes. Ms. Wong indicated that the health monitoring visits have reported observations of teacher interactions with students and the continued monitoring of health items. The program continues its enrollment efforts for the next fiscal year, and has met the non-federal share hours at 25 percent.

Ms. Wong stated the Head Start Program received a State citation for one of our sites, and staff is following the proper procedures to address a corrective action. Ms. Wong invited Board members and District directors to an upcoming Board governance training on June 3, 2015, at 5:00 p.m. The next Head Start Policy Committee will be on June 17, 2015, at 9:00 a.m.

On a question from Bob Bruesch regarding the new Head Start curriculum, Ms. Wong indicated that this is a mandated new curriculum for all agencies which is aligned to the Common Core State Standards.

On a question from Janet Chin regarding the non-Federal Share, Ms. Wong noted an activity calendar sent home in different languages with parent suggestions for different activities geared towards 3- and 4-year old children. This has helped the District to encourage families in completing the required documentation on parent involvement activities. Ms. Chin asked that Board members be provided with a copy of this parent activity calendar.

HEARING OF PERSONS IN THE AUDIENCE

Velia Navarro addressed the Board regarding special education services for her niece. Ms. Navarro was unhappy about the process in scheduling of an Individualized Education Program (IEP); instead, Ms. Navarro was hoping to speak with Mr. Hernandez directly about the matter of scheduling an IEP for her niece. On a question from Mr. Trabanino, Ms. Navarro indicated that her niece's mother has given Ms. Navarro authority to speak on behalf of her niece.

Susan Garcia (through a Spanish-speaking translator) addressed the Board regarding safety procedures and prompt reporting of incidents to protect the Head Start students at Williams School.

Jorge Rodriguez (through a Spanish-speaking translator) addressed the Board regarding two incidents of suspected child abuse in the Williams II classroom which were reported on October 10, 2014, and on April 2, 2015. Mr. Rodriguez spoke of a meeting held with District administrators where information about these incidents was given to parents. Mr. Rodriguez stated that Head Start parents attending tonight's Board meeting are asking for actions from the District to terminate the staff involved in the incidents. Board President Henry Lo asked that, due to legal issues, speakers refrain from mentioning names of students or staff involving these incidents.

Delmy Rojas (through a Spanish-speaking translator) addressed the Board stating that her child was one of the students involved in one of the citations. Ms. Rojas asked that the District make a thorough investigation of the incidents and make appropriate decisions to alleviate how this is affecting both the parents and the staff at Williams School.

Esperanza Ramirez (through a Spanish-speaking translator) addressed the Board regarding her concern about what is happening at the Head Start classes in Williams School. She spoke in support of the parents and for protection of the children.

Jheny Ramirez (through a Spanish-speaking translator) addressed the Board asking that the Board follow its own written procedures to implement improvements in the Head Start program. Ms. Ramirez asked the Board to take the appropriate actions in staff discipline regarding allegations of mis-treatment of children. Ms. Ramirez delivered a petition letter regarding this matter to each Board member.

Elvia Flores (through a Spanish-speaking translator) addressed the Board regarding concerns from parents from Class IV in Williams School, hoping that the Board can work to resolve this controversy among parents and teachers.

Beatriz Sandoval (through a Spanish-speaking translator) addressed the Board stating she was the mother of the child affected by the incident reported in the citation. Ms. Sandoval stated she has not been given a satisfactory answer as to what actually happened. Ms. Sandoval handed out an envelope to each Board member.

Evangelina Pizeno (through a Spanish-speaking translator) addressed the Board regarding the incidents cited in the Head Start citations, asking that parents be listened to and that they be treated with respect.

On a question from Board Member Bob Bruesch, Superintendent Anita Chu stated that the staff involved in the two incidents are not in the classrooms and were placed on paid leave shortly after these incidents. Ms. Chu stated that the District is taking this matter very seriously with actions taken in consultation with LACOE director and our attorney, and that the Board has been briefed about these incidents in a timely manner.
