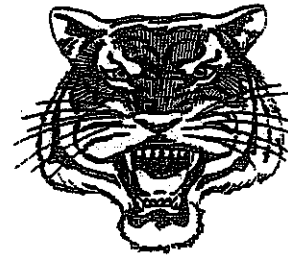

Attached you will find a copy of the State of Texas 2015–16 School Report Card for Smithville Junior High. This is a report required by the Texas Legislature and prepared by the Texas Education Agency. It is to be sent to the parent or guardian of every child enrolled in a Texas public school. The report provides information concerning student performance on the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness (STAAR®), as well as information on student enrollment, class size averages, and financial expenditures.

The information contained in the School Report Card is required by state law. Brief definitions of the items included in the School Report Card may be found online at <http://tea.texas.gov/perfreport/src/index.html> or you may request a copy by contacting my office. The report for our school may or may not have all the information described because the information presented depends on whether the school is an elementary, middle, or high school.

State law requires that the school report card display information about the state, the district, and the school. Where possible, the information must be reported by race/ethnicity and socio-economic status of the students and must include at least two years of results.

Adjunto a esta carta encontrará una copia del reporte de las Calificaciones Escolares del Estado de Texas 2015–16 para Smithville Junior High. 

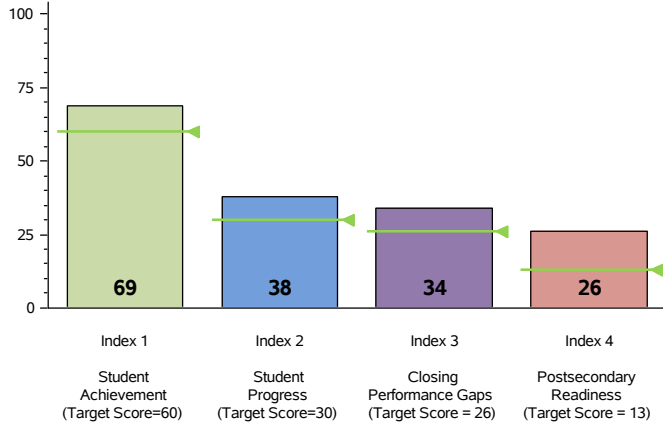

### 2016 Performance Index

State accountability ratings are based on four performance indices: Student Achievement, Student Progress, Closing Performance Gaps, and Postsecondary Readiness.
