## The Trojan Bank is a great training ground for COHS students

Coldspring-Oakhurst High School students make the bank—literally! Trojan Bank is a student-run financial institution nearing its fifth year of operation at the high school.

The bank opened in 2013 courtesy of \$1,000 “seed money” and a color copier donated by the Bank of San Jacinto County, and a COCISD Education Foundation grant for construction.

Students in Susan Caldwell’s Banking and Financial Services class serve as tellers at the bank, which is open during lunch hours in the cafeteria. Services include savings accounts, small loans (under \$4) and change-making. Anyone who attends or works at COHS can open an account.

“Our customers are the high school student body and school employees,” said Caldwell. “Among other things, my students are learning customer service skills, counting back

change, formatting Excel spreadsheets, standard filing rules, ten-key calculator skills, and how to handle past due loans.”

Some of Caldwell’s former students have even been hired to work at other banks and businesses based on their job experience at Trojan Bank.

Caldwell added that the Bank of San Jacinto County remains available in an advisory position to the Trojan Bank.

Not only does the Trojan Bank offer financial services, it provides job experience that opens up career opportunities for students.



## The total COCISD bond package has been approved by voters

COCISD’s total bond package in the amount of \$19,800,000 passed on Tuesday, Nov. 7.

Superintendent Dr. Leland Moore and the Board of Trustees will now begin the process of choosing a contractor and selling the bonds to get the best interest rate possible.

Construction will begin at every campus in the district this summer.
