TCAP EOC Testing (State Required)	-Nov. 27-Dec. 15, 2017 (state window)	High School Fall Block	Used to measure student mastery and growth in state tested subjects over the course of the block. TCAP EOC Testing (State Required)	-April 16-May 4, 2018 (state window)	High School Spring Block and Traditional	Used to measure student mastery and growth in state tested subjects over the course of the year. WIDA ACCESS (English Language Test) (State Required)	-Feb. 20-April 6, 2018	Grades 9-12	Administered to English Learners to evaluate English proficiency.	No grades given. Results shared with parents at the start of the following school year.
ACT (State Required)	-April 3, 2018	Grade 11	Designed to gauge college readiness for students.	Student level reports are provided by ACT approximately three to eight weeks after the administration of the assessment.
MCAA and TCAP-Alt (Alternative Assessments) (State Required)	-March 19-May 4, 2018 (MCAA) -March 19-May 4, 2018 (TCAP-Alt)	Grades 9-12	Administered to students with the most severe cognitive disabilities to measure academic achievement against modified, more accessible academic standards.	Results shared with parents in late May or at the start of the following school year.
Advanced Placement (AP) (Optional)	-May 7-18, 2018	Grades 9-12 enrolled in AP course(s)	Used for students enrolled in AP courses as an option to provide college or university credit and/or advanced placement upon obtaining a predetermined score.	College Board shares scores online in July of 2018.
