## COCISD welcomes community to view plans, learn the facts

COCISD invites you to visit the administration office to learn all there is to know about the bond proposition.

View poster-sized schematics of the planned improvements, including a new entrance to the high school, updated science labs and classrooms, a new Career & Technical Education (CTE) wing that will provide more industry certified course offerings, a new band hall at Lincoln Junior High, and a new addition for the James Street Elementary Pre-K program.

Members of the COCISD Board of Trustees and Superintendent Dr. Leland Moore have traveled around the district over the past month to present the plans and answer questions from the community.

The bond proposal is divided into two propositions on the ballot: Proposition A in the amount of \$18,510,000, for construction purposes, and

Proposition B in the amount of \$1,290,000, to relieve the M&O side of the budget. The M&O side of a school district budget covers daily operating expenses including staff salaries. The total bond package is 19,800,000.

To pay for this bond, the I&S tax would be 15 cents per \$100 of taxable property value.

There are a lot of rumors and misinformation going around about the bond, but there is no turf in the stadium, no fur-lined seats, and no elevator in the press box.
