

# Quality Moreno Valley Schools



- MVUSD serves 35,000 students in 40 schools
- Academic Performance Index (API) score has consistently increased over the past 10 years
- Recent School Highlights:
  - 5 Models of Excellence awards for MVUSD programs from the Riverside County Office of Education in 2013
  - 2 Golden Bell Awards from California School Boards Association in 2013
  - 3 Innovation Federal Grants



# Improving Local Schools



**MVUSD is considering placing a local school bond on the ballot in the November 2014 election to:**

- Modernize schools and classrooms to improve access for students with disabilities
- Provide the facilities and equipment needed for career and technology education classes to prepare students for college and good paying jobs in fields like science, technology and the trades
- Make funding available to protect the quality of instruction in core subjects like math, science and technology
- Upgrade classrooms, science labs, career-training facilities and computer systems to keep pace with technology
- Identify and replace faulty gas pipes to prevent school shutdowns
- Repair leaky roofs, worn-out floors, old, rusty plumbing and faulty electrical systems



# A 21st-Century Education



## A potential bond measure would:

- Add school facilities, equipment and labs needed for career and technology education
- Prepare students for college and good paying jobs in science, technology, the arts, business, and the trades
- Provide students with 21st-century technology skills and a strong background in science and math
- Support college preparation for students who plan to seek a four-year degree
- Provide vocational skills and training so all students are prepared to compete for good paying jobs after high school



# Student Safety is Our Priority



## A potential bond measure would:

- Modernize school facilities to improve access for students with disabilities
- Improve student safety and security systems, including security lighting, fencing, smoke detectors, and fire alarms and sprinklers
- Identify and replace faulty gas pipes to prevent school shutdowns
- Repair or replace leaky roofs, worn-out floors, old, rusty plumbing and faulty electrical systems that are in need of deferred maintenance
- Install long term cost saving energy efficient systems




# Local Control Over Local Funding



**Local funds would ONLY be used for local schools and benefit local students.**

- All funds would stay in our District and could not be taken by the State or used for any other purpose
- Citizen Oversight Committee would review all bond expenditures
- Annual independent audits will ensure the money is spent properly
- Project list details exactly how the money would be used
- Good schools protect the quality of life and home values in MVUSD
