On behalf of the Moreno Valley Unified School District, we would like to introduce you to our Parent Ambassador program. As outlined in the District's Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP), the team of ambassadors is charged with developing relationships within the community to get more people involved in the decision-making process at the local, district and regional level to improve the quality of education. Parent Ambassadors will increase awareness of cultural learning differences and promote an understanding among parents, educators and others about culturally sensitive issues relating to the education of all students. Your involvement can help MVUSD fulfill its mission:

The mission of Moreno Valley Unified School District is to ensure all students graduate high school prepared to successfully enter into higher education and/or pursue a viable career path.

There are many ways parents and community partners can foster awareness and support students. Some examples include:

- Attending school events, such as Back to School Nights and Open House, and participating in school organizations, such as Parent Advisory Councils and School Site Councils to demonstrate appreciation of multicultural diversity;
- Volunteering on campus to interact with students and provide a positive role model for a specific cultural group;
- Attending meetings to learn about school and district initiatives and programs;
- Hosting meetings or events highlighting a particular subject of interest; and
- **Signing a Parent Commitment Slip to read the MVUSD Strategic Plan and pledge some volunteer hours.**

We have a goal to collect 10,000 Parent Commitment Slips and increase the presence of parent volunteers on all of our campuses. We encourage you to meet with our Parent Ambassadors to discuss potential endeavors and outline expectations for activities and/or efforts of support that will benefit students and the community.

Parents and community members who would like to work directly with students must complete the same background check as school employees, including fingerprinting and TB test.
