

## 2 Together in Mission Helping our neighbor

Our *Together in Mission* speaker this weekend, Maria Jimenez, has a lifetime of experience with Catholic schools. She has been principal of St. Madeleine School in Pomona for nine years. Before that assignment, she taught in Catholic schools for 25 years. She was also a student at Catholic schools since the age of 5. This represents 50 years in Catholic education.

Her commitment to Catholic education came from her parents who sent six through parochial schools with financial assistance. Parents at St. Madeleine's are equally committed.

"Fully 99 percent of our students receive some form of financial aid," she says. "The families dream of sending the first member of their family to college. Their commitment means working two or three jobs, and donating many items the school cannot afford on its slim budget, such as office supplies, water and juice, sports equipment, even toilet paper."

Families at St. Madeleine's come from Pomona where rents are surprisingly high, she notes. About 30 of the 100 families qualify for financial assistance from the Archdiocese which means income as low as \$20,000 for a family of four. All of the families struggle with traditional fundraising, so most of the school events are "community building," she adds.

She is deeply grateful to OLA for its generous contribution to *Together in Mission* which keeps the doors of St. Madeleine open to serve these families.

All workshop participants will be introduced to this new tool that helps ease families into the conversation you have wanted to have with them about your end-of-life wishes.

Reservations are not required but would be helpful for our planning, through Lynne Stella at (909) 985-3765 who can also answer questions. Each family will be given a packet of information that reflects the messages of the speakers.



## Parishioners support Summer Mission Trip



## Fair Trade chocolate

Consumers who know the story of chocolate will make their selection with care and choose Fair Trade. Convenient sales of Fair Trade products will be offered Sunday, Feb. 12, on the OLA patio after morning Masses.

Most chocolate consumed in the U.S. is sourced from plantations in West Africa which use children who have been kidnapped, sold and often beaten if unproductive. This is one form of human slavery or human trafficking that is not widely known.

By contrast, chocolate that is certified Fair Trade is manufactured through cooperation with plantations that are free of slave labor. Farmers are organized into cooperative that negotiate fair compensation and safe working conditions for laborers. Cooperatives may also provide educational opportunities, medical care for communities, and an equal voice for women. Care is also required for farming practices that protect the environment.

This Valentine's Day, honor your loved one by making the choice with loving values – Fair Trade – and ask local merchants to sell Fair Trade products. Pope Francis says, "It is good for people to realize that purchasing is always a moral act."

## Help CHAP laundry service for the homeless

Claremont Homeless Advocacy Program (CHAP) provides overnight accommodations to the homeless at the Friends Hall on Harrison Avenue. In addition to an evening meal, showers are made available. Help is currently needed to provide towels for this service: 1) Coordinator - who checks periodically with launderers and helps find coverage when volunteers are sick or away; monitors completion of laundering; and acts as contact person with overnight supervisor. 2) Assistant who handles Saturday laundry needs and 3) Substitutes to fill in as needed. ## Unidos en Misión: Ayudando a nuestro prójimo


Nuestra presentadora de Unidos en Misión este fin de semana, María Jiménez, tiene toda una vida de experiencia con las escuelas Católicas. Ha sido directora de la Escuela Santa Magdalena en Pomona durante nueve años. Antes de esa asignación, enseñó en escuelas Católicas durante 25 años. Ella también fue estudiante en escuelas Católicas desde la edad de 5 años. Esto representa 50 años en la educación Católica.

Su compromiso a la educación Católica provino de sus padres, quienes enviaron a seis a escuelas parroquiales con ayuda financiera. Los padres de Santa Magdalena son igualmente comprometidos.

"El 99% de nuestros estudiantes reciben algún tipo de ayuda financiera", dice ella. "Las familias sueñan con enviar al primer miembro de su familia a la universidad. Su compromiso significa tener dos o tres trabajos y donar artículos que la escuela no puede pagar por su escaso presupuesto, como suministros de oficina, agua y jugo, equipo deportivo e incluso papel higiénico."

Las familias de Santa Magdalena vienen de Pomona, donde las rentas son sorprendentemente altas, señala la directora. Alrededor de 30 de las 100 familias califican para la asistencia financiera de la Arquidiócesis, lo que significa ingresos tan bajos como \$20,000 para una familia de cuatro. Todas las familias luchan con la recaudación de fondos tradicionales, por lo que la mayoría de los eventos escolares son "para crear comunidad", añade.

Ella está profundamente agradecida con Nuestra Señora de la Asunción por su generosa contribución a Unidos en Misión, que mantiene abiertas las puertas de Santa Magdalena para servir a estas familias.


