This Newsletter is an effort to keep you up to date on new developments in the District.

- Please review the information below as our goal is have a safe campus (both inside and out!) as well as preserve our learning tools (computers) for the longer term.
- The infrastructure project to improve WiFi access throughout the campus has been completed in the schools and at Achieve. This will allow the wider use of laptops, chromebooks and other devices with less interruption of internet connectivity. Management of non-educational devices (student phones and tablets) will help in maintaining the educational aspect of online learning in the future.
- Migration of building support Servers to our Host Servers is complete. This allows for backup of our data as well as redundant network historical data in case of a severe loss of facilities.
- We have received the chomebooks and carts for the Elementary buildings grades 3 – 6. The Deployment timeframe to classrooms is scheduled around the Christmas Holiday break. This will permit ample familiarization by students prior to the spring testing time. This schedule coordinates technology availability with the Teaching & Learning Strategic 5 year plan.
- Determining the transition timetable of both classroom equipment and utilization of equipment in conjunction with new processes in the educational environment is part of the overall strategic plan.
- **REMINDER:** The “Local C:” Folder is not to be used to save any material that would be lost if the system were to go down. This folder is NOT backed up and therefore if information is to be saved or used in the future it is to be saved in a network folder. Pictures and Videos not saved in a folder in Documents, on the Desktop or in Favorites are not backed up.

We are excited to be able to share this update with the District and to continue to help in the improvement of the educational environment for our students.

Addendum:

The **Jr./Sr. High** driveways and parking areas have been sealcoated and restriped.

The speed limit on Campus is 15 MPH!

Driving on campus is a privilege and can be revoked for violations.

South Elementary's address has changed to 1743 Adams Road.

Drivers **MUST** enter off Adams road as the driveway towards the Board of Education building is now **ONE WAY OUT** at all times.

The Werner Avenue entrance is permanently closed to school traffic and is designated for residents only!

5513-CARE OF SCHOOL PROPERTY

The Board of Education believes that the schools should help students learn to respect property and develop feelings of pride in community institutions.

The Board charges each student with responsibility for the proper care of school property and the school supplies and equipment entrusted to his/her use.

Students who cause damage to school property shall be subject to disciplinary measures, and their parents shall be financially liable for such damage to the extent of the law, except that students over eighteen (18) years of age shall also be liable for damage they cause.

The Board authorizes the imposition of fines for the loss, damage or destruction of school equipment, apparatus, musical instruments, library material, textbooks, and for damage to school buildings and reserves the right, to the extent permitted by the law, to withhold a report card or credits from any student whose payment of such fine is in arrears.

The Board may report to the appropriate authorities any student whose damage of school property has been serious or chronic in nature.

A reward may be offered by the Board for the apprehension of any person who vandalizes school property.

The Superintendent shall develop administrative guidelines to implement this policy.
