The **MYAC** provides the youth of Caldwell an opportunity to voice their opinions and share a role in the decision-making process of their community's future.


Membership is through an application process. Applications are available in the main office, Caldwell City Hall, and on the school website.

Meetings are held every 1st and 3rd Wednesday of the month at 5:30pm in the Community Room at the Caldwell Police Station.


Science Bowl
