## **1<sup>st</sup> Day of Classes for NLMUSD Schools is Aug. 16 All Campuses Still Accepting New Students**

The first day of classes for the Norwalk-La Mirada Unified School District is Thursday, Aug. 16, 2018. All 28 campuses of the K-12 district, which encompasses the cities of Norwalk, La Mirada and a portion of Santa Fe Springs, are still accepting new students.

NLMUSD features many award-winning schools and 21<sup>st</sup> century learning programs, including Morrison Elementary School in Norwalk and Escalona Elementary School in La Mirada, which were each recently named as a California Distinguished School by the state Department of Education.

In addition, Gardenhill Elementary School in La Mirada was named during the 2017-18 academic year as a PTA National PTA School of Excellence and a Project Lead the Way National Distinguished School.

All the NLMUSD campuses — 17 elementary schools, 6 middle schools and 5 high schools — are part of the district's technology integration plan called the 2020 Learning Initiative, which will dramatically increase student access to and use of digital devices such as iPads, Chromebooks and iMacs.

Also, there are various outdoor renovations around the district that are now underway or planned. These include major stadium and athletic field upgrades in Norwalk for John Glenn High School, Norwalk High School and Corvallis Middle School, and sports field improvements at Benton Visual and Performing Arts Magnet Middle School in La Mirada and a gym expansion for La Mirada High School.
