

**Robert C. Bata** (Fundraising/Development, Policy/Governance, and Strategic Planning Committees) is the Principal of Warwick Place Legal, LLC, a management consulting firm that advises law firms on their international strategies. A prominent international corporate lawyer and litigator, he was the founder and managing partner of the international offices and regional practices of several major U.S. law firms throughout the emerging markets of Central and Eastern Europe and China, and in London. He and his family were based in Prague and then London for about fifteen years before returning to New York.
