MPAA R-rated audiovisual media or any unrated material that might fall into this category may ONLY be used in high school Grades 9–12 with principal and parental WRITTEN approval prior to the scheduled viewing date and must comply with the school's policy on relevance and depth of meaning for the evaluation and selection of instructional materials. **The parental approval letter should include the MPAA rating of the material.**

MPAA PG-13-rated audiovisual media or any unrated material that might fall into this category may be used in high school Grades 9–12 with the prior approval of your administrator and must comply with the school's policy on the evaluation and selection of instructional materials.

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
