Classrooms and labs require updates so students receive the needed training and preparation to succeed in college and tomorrow's careers.



Safety Upgrades and Essential Repairs to Our Aging High Schools

Many of the high schools in our area were built more than 60 years ago. Safety improvements and essential repairs for earthquake retrofits and asbestos removal are needed to ensure all schools meet modern safety standards.



Local School Improvement Measure

To maintain high-quality education, the Campbell Union High School District Board of Trustees voted unanimously on June 16th to place a \$275 million bond measure on the November 2016 ballot. The measure would:

- Repair leaky roofs
- Remove hazardous asbestos from school buildings
- Upgrade classrooms and labs for science, engineering, robotics, coding, biotech and computer technology courses to prepare our students for 21st-century careers in Silicon Valley and to be competitive in today's worldwide job market
- Provide access to classrooms and restrooms for students and teachers with disabilities
- Upgrade technology infrastructure in aging schools, including wiring, networks and science labs as well as improving classroom learning technology
- Strengthen seismic safety of school buildings
- Update instructional technology to prepare graduates to compete for college and careers

Fiscal Accountability

- Every penny raised by the measure would be used for our local high schools
- None of the funds could be taken away by the State
- None of the funds could be used for administrators' salaries, benefits or pensions
- The cost of this measure would be limited to no more than \$30 per \$100,000 in assessed (not market) value
- Independent citizens' oversight and annual audits would be required to keep the district accountable for how funds are spent
