


Bigfoot-Giving!

Can my comics be part of the *Lenape Times*?



Hand Turkey

A fun Thanksgiving craft

Materials: brown construction paper, yellow construction paper, pencil or sharpie, scissors, glue, and orange and red construction paper.

1. Get the brown construction paper and the pencil.
2. Trace your hand on the brown construction paper.
3. Cut the turkey out.
4. Next, on the yellow construction paper, draw a small rectangle going vertical (up and down).
5. Now, draw 2 more small rectangles going diagonal so they connect to the first rectangle.
6. Cut out the turkey's foot.
7. Erase all of the pencil lines.
8. Glue the turkey's foot to the turkey.
9. Repeat steps 4-8.
10. Draw a tiny triangle for the beak.
11. Glue the beak onto the turkey.
12. Next, trace one finger on the orange and/or red construction paper and cut the finger out.
13. Glue the finger trace onto the correct turkey feather.
14. Repeat steps 12 and 13 until all of your fingers have been traced.
15. Enjoy your turkey.
