How will District 100 use the increased revenue from the referendum?

A \$2 million referendum will allow the district to improve educational programs, retain quality staff, continue to offer after school sports and clubs, maintain preschool programs, and begin to provide a more financially stable environment for the future.

How does the referendum impact South Berwyn residents?

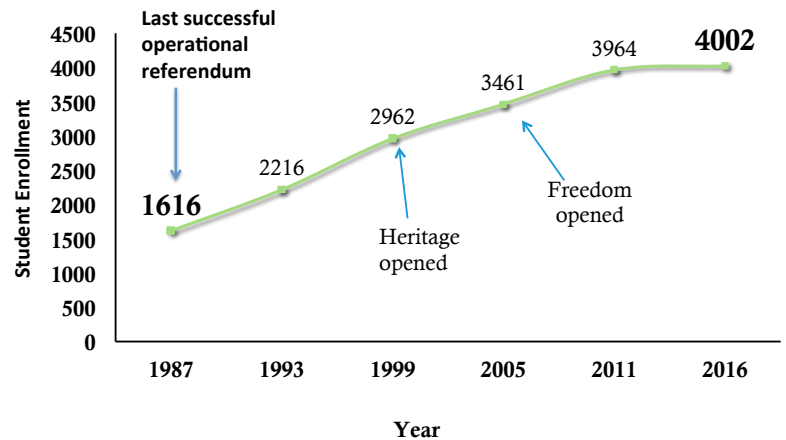
Strong school systems improve property values, attract new families and businesses, and strengthen the community.

What if the referendum does not pass?

District 100 will need to make budget cuts for the 2017-2018 school year. Potential cuts include:

- Eliminate after school clubs & sports
- Eliminate Fine Arts programs
- Increase class sizes
- Reduce staff
- Eliminate community preschool
- Increase fees

D100 Referendum History



- The student enrollment in District 100 is 4,002 students.
- District 100 has not passed an operational referendum in 30 years.
- Student enrollment has increased 149% since the 1987 operational referendum.
- State funding cuts have cost the district more than \$8 million since 2012.
- The approximate cost of a \$2 million referendum is \$38 per year per \$1,000 of a current tax bill.

Impact based on current tax bill	yearly	monthly
Increase per \$1,000 of current tax bill	\$38	\$3
Increase for \$3,000 annual tax bill	\$113	\$9
Increase for \$5,000 annual tax bill	\$188	\$16
Increase for \$7,000 annual tax bill	\$264	\$22
