- Provide clarification on what Title 1 means for their child Introduce the Parent Resource Center and contents
- Reference social support outside the school building to ensure an adequate home environment

Advisory Council

Tyro Elementary School will provide opportunities for all parents to openly participate in on the Advisory Council. This council meets 5 times per year and is considered to be a liaison between the school and community.
