## **COMMUNITY**

The Ukiah Unified School District services the incorporated city of Ukiah plus the four smaller communities of Redwood Valley, Calpella, Talmage, and Hopland, and their surrounding areas -- a total of 495 square miles with a population of approximately 40,000 (15,500 in the city of Ukiah).

Ukiah is located 100 miles north of San Francisco on Highway 101 and is the county seat of the County of Mendocino.

Agriculture, government, education, lumber and wood products, light industry, service occupations and professions account for a large majority of the area's employment. The District is comprised of eight elementary schools, two middle schools, a continuation high school, and a comprehensive high school. Ukiah is also the home of Mendocino Community College.

## **SCHOOL**

Description: Founded in 1893, Ukiah High School is a comprehensive four year high school. A new campus, built on 60 acres in the northwest portion of the city, was completed in 1978. The school was recognized as a California Distinguished School in 1988 and 2001.

## **GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS**

230 credits are required to include the following subject requirements:

- 40 credits    English
- 30 credits    Social Science, to include World History, U.S. History and American Institutions (civics/economics)
- 20 credits    Mathematics, to include Algebra
- 20 credits    Physical Education
- 20 credits    Science, to include one Biological and one Physical Science
- 10 credits    Visual/Performing Art or Foreign Language
- 90 credits    Elective

State required competencies in reading, writing, and mathematics are embedded in the curriculum.

AP exams are available in coursework listed as AP. In 2016, 212 candidates completed 398 AP exams. Of the 398 exams, 19% were fives, 24% were fours, 30% were threes, 20% were twos, and 7% percent were ones.
