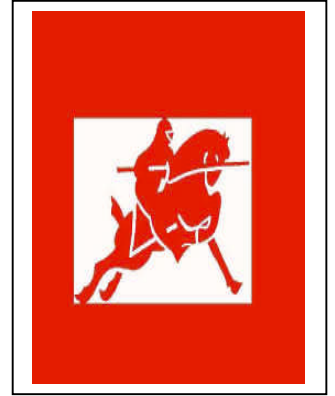


Thomas W. Harvey High School Class of 1952



Academics:

120 out of 130 members (92%) of the class continued their education after high school

Athletics:

The Class of 1952 football team, under coach Jack Britt, achieved the first undefeated, untied season in the history of Thomas W. Harvey High School

The Class of 1952 was the winner of the first Northeastern Conference Football Championship

The Class of 1952 won the first Northeastern Conference Basketball Championship

The Class of 1952 took 2nd place in the Northeastern Conference Track and Field Championship

School Pride:

Class Philosophy – “One for All and All for One”. Non-athletes of the Class of 1952 supported all the sports functions with faithful attendance and vocal support. Likewise, athletes supported and attended drama, choral, and band presentations. This attitude of “mutual support” was evident throughout all activities at Harvey High School.

Civic Pride:

The citizens of Painesville rallied around Harvey athletic endeavors. It was not uncommon to have crowds as large as 4,000 in attendance at football games. More important was the fact that the entire community joined in the celebration as the Red Raider Marching Band led the community into Recreation Park by marching from Harvey to the games in the park. The Class of 1952 was instrumental in the development of this civic pride through their athletic endeavors, their leadership, and their support for each other.
