Dear Parent or Guardian:

We are pleased to inform you that Diocese of Baton Child Nutrition Program at **Cristo Rey Franciscan High School** will be implementing the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) for School Year 2017-2018.

What does this mean for you and your children attending the school identified above?

Great news for you and your students! All enrolled students of Cristo Rey are eligible to receive a healthy breakfast and lunch at school at **no charge** to your household each day of the 2017-2018 school year.

What do you have to do?

No further action is required of you. Your child(ren) will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or submit a meal application.

However, this does not include the purchase of Extra Sales items. If your child purchases Extra Sales items (for example: extra meal items, milk, bottled water, etc.), he/she must have money in his/her meal account. No charging will be allowed!
