Thank you so much for participating in today's National Walk Out and thank you to everyone who helped us prepare for this event. // More than twenty five hundred (2500) Walkouts are occurring right now across the nation sending a message of solidarity to fellow students and teachers and that enough is enough. // We will now use this time to remember the victims, 14 students and 3 adults, from Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School.

Today is exactly 1 month since the tragic shooting at MSD in Parkland, Florida. While it is difficult to find positivity in times like these and grief may be overwhelming, we are standing together, finding hope in each other, and we know that WE are the change. 2. **C:** Scott Beigel. 35 years old. Geography teacher and camp starlight counselor, someone you strive to be like. Died shielding his students from gunfire.
3. **E:** Martin Duque (pronounce: Du-kay). 14 years old. Sweet, caring, football fan and devout church-goer.
4. **C:** Nicholas Dworet (pronounce: Dwo-ret). 17 years old. Competitive swimmer with olympic aspirations who was granted a scholarship to the University of Indianapolis.
5. **K:** Aaron Feis. 37 years old. Assistant football coach and security monitor, a husband and a father.
6. **G:** Jaime Guttenberg. 14 years old. A Dancer. She loved animals and hoped to be an occupational therapist in the future.
7. **C:** Chris Hixon. 49 years old. Served in the Persian Gulf War, Athletic director, wrestling coach, a husband and father and the kind of person that would do anything for anybody.
