



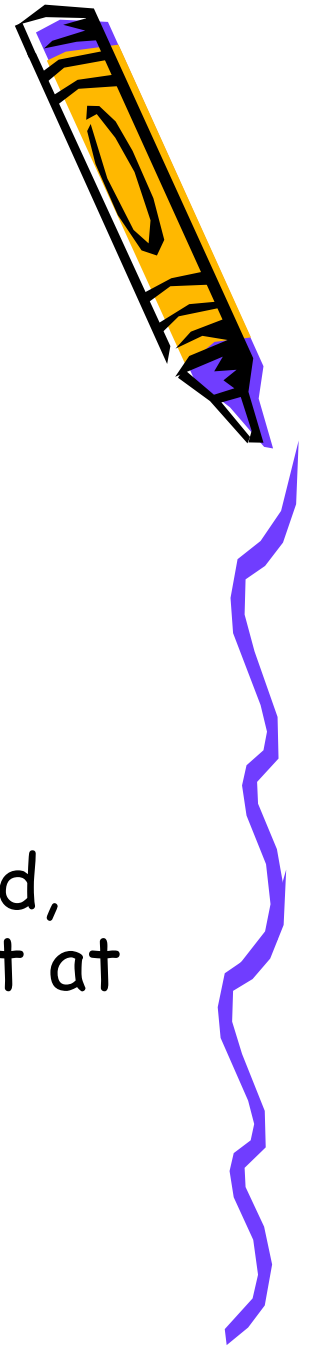
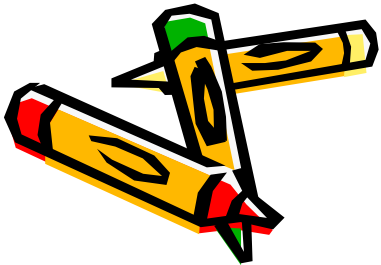

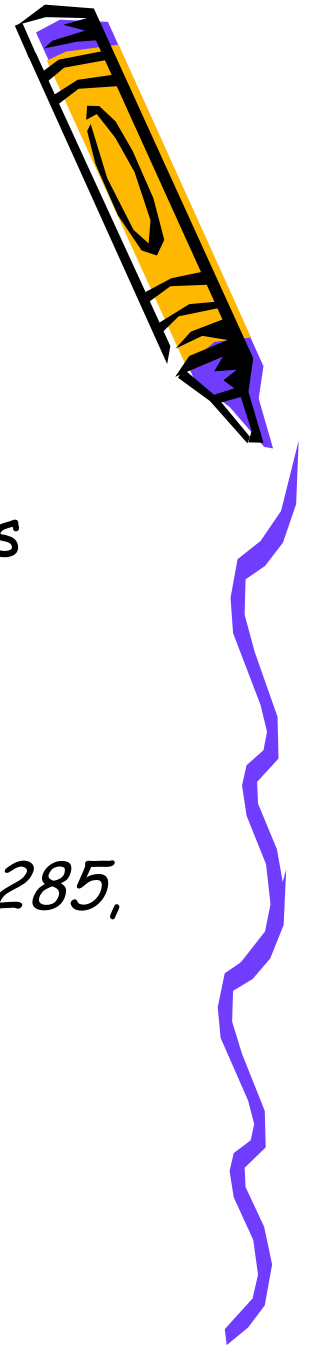
Suncrest's Pledge Against Bullying

- We will not bully others.
- We will try to help students who are bullied.
- We will include students who are easily left out.
- When we know somebody is being bullied, we will tell an adult at school or an adult at home.



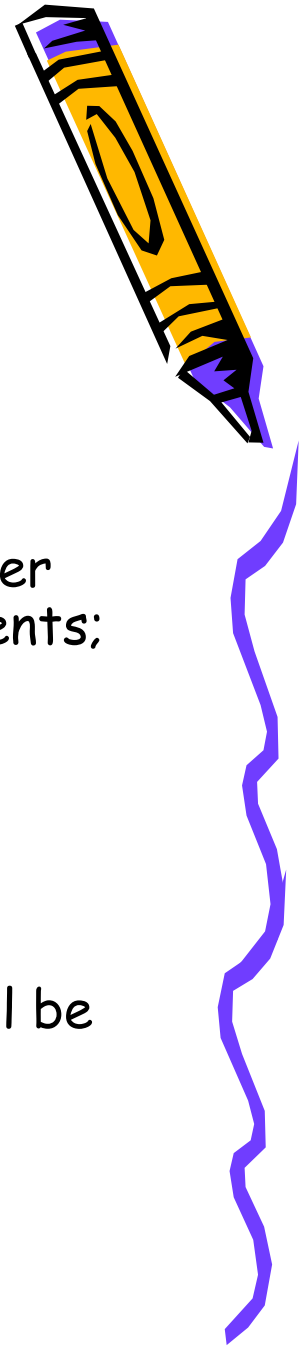
Suncrest's Bullying Policy

- First Reported Offense
 - Child receives bullying review and must pass bullying exam
 - Child must complete 4 A's
 - An incident report will be filed
 - A copy of the incident report, *Senate Act 285*, Suncrest's Bullying Policy, and bullying literature will be sent home to parent.



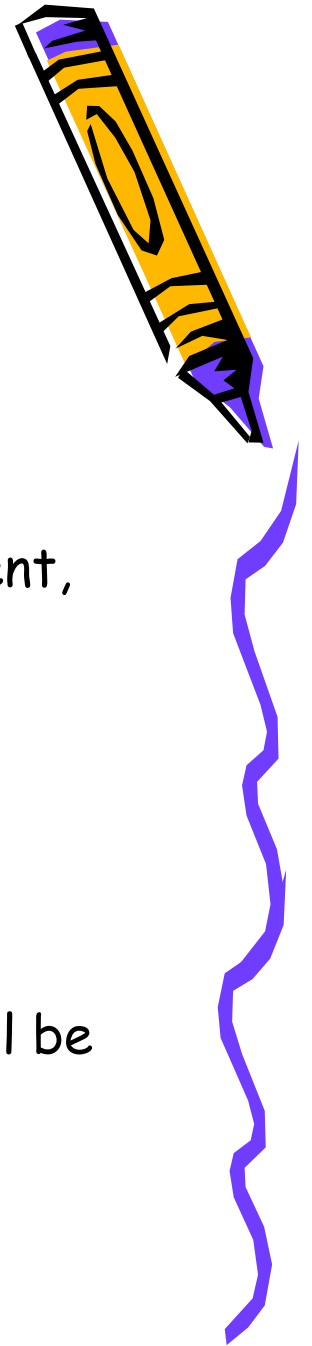
Suncrest's Bullying Policy

- Second Reported Offense
 - *Strike One*
 - Child must complete designated amount of "Character Cards" (age appropriate character building assignments; i.e. 2pg paper on MLK Jr.)
 - One day of ISS and 3 days of "modified" recess privileges
 - An incident report will be filed
 - A copy of the incident report, *Senate Act 285*, Suncrest's Bullying Policy, and bullying literature will be sent home to parent.



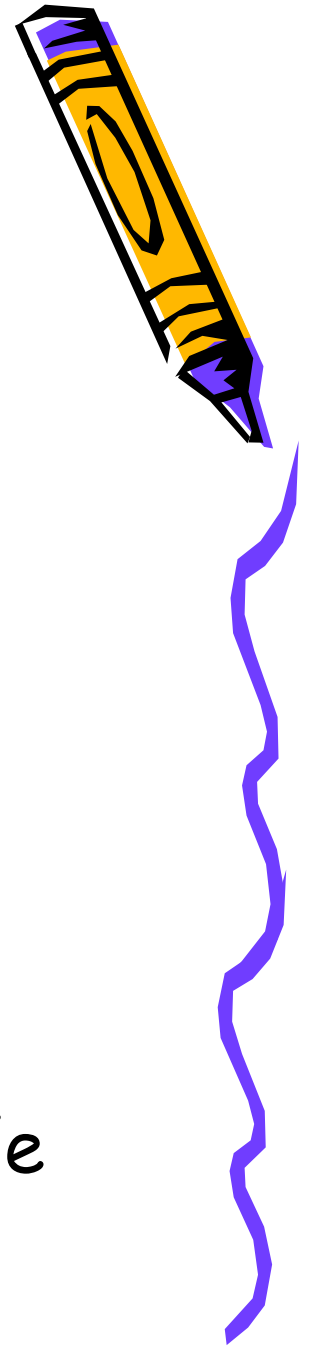
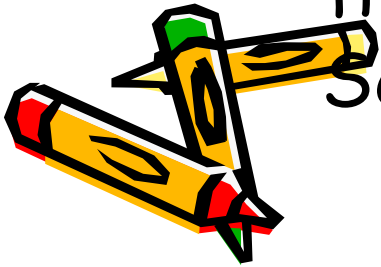
Suncrest's Bullying Policy

- Third Reported Offense
 - *Strike Two*
 - Community Service (3 hours) or if no parental consent, OSS
 - Police Intervention
 - Parent required to meet with "Bullying Committee"
 - Two days ISS and five days "modified" recess
 - An incident report will be filed
 - A copy of the incident report, *Senate Act 285*, Suncrest's Bullying Policy, and bullying literature will be sent home to parent.



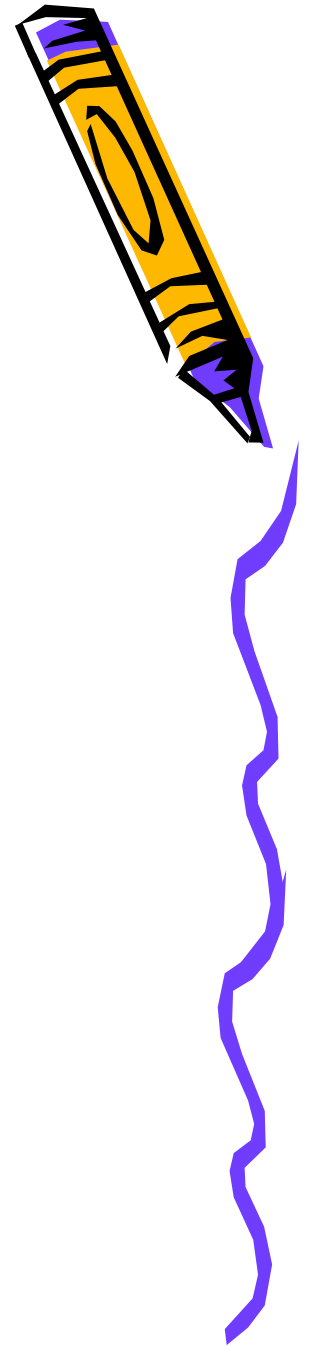
Suncrest's Bullying Policy

- Fourth Reported Offense
 - *Strike Three*
 - Out of School Suspension for appropriate number of days as determined by school.
 - Five days of "modified" recess
 - Mental Health Services provided through school (paid for through Safe School Fund)



Suncrest's Bullying Policy

- Fifth Reported Offense
 - Expulsion



Enforcement of Policy

Procedure

- 1) Reported incident (written or verbal) by student or school personnel
- 2) Investigation conducted by Principal and Counselor
- 3) Investigation findings are then presented to a pre-determined "Bullying Committee" to determine legitimacy of accusations whether student has broken school's bullying policy.
