Holy Family High School understands the sacrifices families make to invest in Catholic education for their students. Holy Family offers a variety of scholarships and tuition assistance to help students from varied economic backgrounds. Holy Family historically awards over \$1 million of tuition assistance each school year.

Tuition Rates

Parish affiliated tuition for the 2017/2018 school year is \$10,600. Each family must submit to Holy Family High School a parish affiliation form with a parish by the registration deadline to receive this rate.

Unaffiliated tuition for the 2017/2018 school year is \$12,300.

Each student is required to pay a \$250 annual Facility Improvement Fee.

Tuition payments are made under one of the following payment plan options:

1. Full tuition and facility fee payment due July 1, 2018. This payment option earns a \$150 discount.
2. Two semester payments for tuition and facility fee due July 1, 2018 and December 1, 2018.
3. Eleven equal payments (tuition and facility fee) payable July 2017 through May 2018.

Tuition and fees for the 2018/2019 school year will be determined in the spring of 2018.

Multiple Student Discount

Holy Family High School offers multiple student discounts for families with more than one student enrolled at the school. The discount is \$500 for the second student enrolled and \$600 for each additional student.

Scholarship Opportunities

➤ Sister Aline Dalton Alumni Scholarship

Holy Family High School awards a half-tuition scholarship annually to an incoming son or daughter of a Holy Family High School alumnus or alumna. This scholarship is named for Sister Aline Dalton, a former Principal and Alumni Director of Holy Family High School.

The scholarship is renewable yearly, provided the recipient actively participates in at least three school clubs, teams and/or co-curricular activities and maintains a cumulative G.P.A. of 2.5 or higher with no semester grade lower than a "C".

Nominations are made by the student's school.

➤ Loyalty Scholarship

Holy Family High School awards four Loyalty Scholarships each year to incoming eighth grade students from the Catholic schools of the Archdiocese of Denver. These scholarships are half-tuition grants which are renewable yearly, provided the recipient maintains a 3.0 G.P.A. or higher with no semester grade lower than a "C". Additionally the student must be a positive, active member of the Holy Family High School community.

Nominations are made by the student's school.

➤ Franciscan Service Scholarship

Holy Family High School awards six, \$1,500 scholarships annually to incoming eighth grade students from the Catholic Schools or parishes of the Archdiocese of Denver. These awards are given to eighth graders who demonstrate a commitment to service to others. These scholarships are renewable yearly, provided the recipient is an active and positive member of Holy Family High School, continues to demonstrate his or her commitment to serving others and maintains a G.P.A. of 2.5 or higher with no semester grade lower than a "C".

Nominations are made by the student's parish or school.

➤ **Freedom Scholarship**

Holy Family High school awards two Freedom Scholarships each year to incoming eighth grade students whose parent or legal guardian is a Police Officer, Firefighter, First Responder, active Military or Military Veteran. These scholarships are renewable yearly, provided the recipient continues to demonstrate a commitment to a Catholic secondary education and to the teachings of the Catholic faith, and maintains a G.P.A. of 2.5 or higher with no semester grade lower than a "C".

➤ **ACE Scholarships**

Alliance for Choice in Education (ACE) provides scholarships to Colorado families who qualify for the Federal Free and Reduced Lunch Program. A limited number of applications are available each year through the Business Office. Families will be notified by the Business Office if they qualify for an application. The amount of financial assistance awarded is \$3,000 per academic year. The awards are renewable each year and follow a student from lower grades through high school. Families interested in qualifying for the scholarships must submit Federal tax returns to the Holy Family Business Office to qualify for renewal for the next school year. ➤ **Schmitz Family Foundation Scholarships**

The Schmitz Family Foundation supports Holy Family students through scholarships of \$3,000, based on income level. A limited number of applications are available each year. Families will be notified by the Business Office if they qualify for an application. At least one person in the family must be employed, and federal income tax forms must be included with the application. Students must maintain at least a 2.0 G.P.A. ➤ **Parish Scholarships**

Scholarships are offered from several of the parishes within the Archdiocese for students to attend Holy Family High School. Please contact your local parish to ask about these scholarship opportunities.

Universal Education Supporters

Universal Education Supporters, Inc. (UES) is a non-profit organization that has the sole purpose to serve Catholic Education, Pre-K thru College, and help families meet their tuition obligations or other educational costs through scholarships.

UES contracts with Aramark and Centerplate to operate concession stands at multiple sports parks in the Denver metro area: Coors Field, Sports Authority, Dicks, Pepsi Center and Fiddler's Green. UES staffs these stands with UES volunteers. Once you are a member, you and your family will have access to the UES scheduler and will be able to sign up for the events you are able to volunteer. Shifts range from 6-8 hours depending on the sport, event and venue. Aramark and Centerplate make contributions to UES, and UES makes these funds available for scholarships to Catholic schools. Scholarships are paid directly to students/parents and can be used to pay tuition and related education expenses (books, supplies, etc.)

Tuition Assistance

Tuition assistance is given to families who apply and qualify based upon an analysis of data that each family submits annually.

Incoming freshmen for the 2018-2019 school year may apply for financial aid beginning December 1, 2017 through January 15, 2018. Tax returns for the previous year and a W-2 are required to complete the financial aid application.

Students in grades 10-12 may apply for financial aid from February 1, 2018 through March 31, 2018. 2017 completed tax returns and a W-2 are required to complete the financial aid application. All applications will be processed at the same time.
